Lifelong Learning courses cover a broad range of topics, from Art Appreciation to Philosophy.

Courses are offered in Autumn and Spring with each course lasting between six and eight weeks.

University Access

The University Access courses are one-year, part-time courses designed to prepare adults, who may not have formal qualifications, for successful study at university. These are Special Purpose Awards (Level 6) which equip mature students with the skills and confidence required to take the next step to selected degree courses at UCD.

The University Access courses are open to mature students - meaning those over the age of 22 on January first, 2023.

We offer two University Access courses

- Diploma in Access to Arts, Humanities, Social Sciences & Law - Access to AHSSL
- Diploma in Access to Science, Engineering, Agricultural Science & Medicine, and Veterinary Medicine
 - Access to SFAM

Open Learning

Open Learning is a flexible way of studying part-time at UCD. It allows you to select the modules you wish to study, set the pace of your study, and whether you undertake the module assessment. There are 13 progression pathways to undergraduate degree programmes in UCD if you are taking the Certificate in Open Learning (30 credits). You can also take Open Learning for interest (audit modules) or for CPD (continuing professional development) purposes.

As an Open Learner, you have access to the same amenities as other UCD Undergraduate students such as the gym and library.

Most modules can be taken either for audit (€375 per module) or for credit (€500 per module).

Students apply to Open Learning through our website and online applications open on 8th August 2023.
