A. POLITICS 1909-21

I. Sinn Fein

1 10 February 1909 Copy of *Irish in the New University* concerning the declarations and resolutions adopted by members of Sinn Fein at a meeting in New York.

II. Volunteers

- 24 September 1914 Two typescript copy circulars issued to members of the Irish Volunteers concerning the statement made by John Redmond that it is 'the duty of the Irish Volunteers to take foreign services under a government which is not Irish.' As this was done without prior consultation with the Provincial Committee of the Volunteers it is now declared that Redmond is no longer entitled, through his twenty-five nominees, to any place in the administration and guidance of the Irish Volunteers Organisation.  Starkie Resident Commissioner, Board of National Education, concerning the order his Department issued to Jeremiah O'Connell, Filemore Boys School, Cahirciveen, to cease all connection with the Irish Volunteer organisation in which it claimed this organisation is openly hostile to the government of Ireland and the recruitment for the forces of the crown' and concerning the suspension of his salary 'until he had satisfied them that he had ceased all connection with the Irish

Volunteers.' A large number of the teachers under the Board (of Education), however, have been and still are permitted to become and remain members of the Ulster Volunteer Force. As the Department does not substantiate their claim about the Irish Volunteers, MacNeill states that it 'is clearly engaged in an invasion of public privacy' and its action is 'lawless, oppressive and intolerable.'

Manuscript notes concerning a fierv letter' 'rather received from a volunteer criticising his advice not to rush into any acts of 'hasty, undisciplined and foolish violence' having read into this advice 'a great deal more' than MacNeill had meant.

George to Sir Horace Plunkett chairman of the Irish Convention on Home Rule regarding discussions with representatives of this convention. A typescript address on vegetable parchment 'To the President of the United States of America' (Woodrow Wilson) protesting against the introduction of conscription in Ireland and outlining attempts by the British government to 'inflame prejudice' against Ireland in this matter.' This address was given at the Mansion House and signed by Lawrence O'Neill, Lord Mayor of Dublin, and chairman of 'a conference of Representative Irishmen' including John Dillon, T M Healy and William O'Brien. Thomas Kelly and John MacNeill are also included and are 'meeting in the place of E de Valera and Arthur Griffith, deported 18 May 1918 to separate prisons in England without trial or accusation, communication with whom has been cut off.' 11pp

Proportional Representation:

Typescript copy Ministerial Report from the Department of Home Affairs concerning a number of issues such as the progress of

Republican courts, and of the Republican Police, the establishment of a Relief Bureau under the Department for the purposes of coordinating relief work, and the emigration situation which shows a 'decided falling-off when compared with other years.'

A 'Decree As to Purported Exercise of Public Functions' issued by the

Minister for Home Affairs. Regarding those persons who 'purport to exercise judicial, administrative and legislative functions without the authority of the Republic' and also persons who 'act as clerks.' The decree states that the Minister can take action against such people and lists the type of penalties which may be imposed.

Prisoners: Reports outlining the conditions and the treatment of prisoners by the Provisional Government; descriptions of conditions in a number of prisons such as Wellington Barracks where 'over-crowding and insanitary conditions continue' and where there is 'brutal ill-treatment of prisoners'; list of those prisoners wounded or killed within these prisons; Prison News, critical of 'the latest clumsy experiment in imperial tactics of the Provisional Government- their effort to "divide and conquer" the Republican Ranks.' 3 items

Proposes the employment of a Trade Agent who would 'explore every possible avenue likely to strengthen Ireland's trading relations' and states that were the Ministry to agree with this case he would be glad to act at Liverpool in the capacity of Irish Trade Agent.

copy of a memorandum responding to a memorandum sent to the Executive Council by the representative of the Ministry of Finance on the report of the Committee set up to examine whether the proposals put forward by this Ministry in connection with rates for the year 1924/25 are financially and administratively practicable.

Two 'confidential' letters from P Coffey, Maynooth College, to

MacNeill concerning economic and financial policy in Ireland and relating to rejected financial proposals which he and a colleague put before President Cosgrave in 1922. Includes a number of suggestions regarding such issues as imports and exports, financial settlement with England, separation of currency system from that of England and the way in which capitalist finance is 'strangling' industry. Also encloses a number of newspaper articles, not attached, which he himself wrote concerning such matters which he hopes may find their way from MacNeill to the hands of some of the heads of the Department of Finance, or Industry and Commerce, or Agriculture.

The government cannot commit itself to this minimum grant of £25,000 in the absence of full justification in detail.'

Newspaper cutting from *The Morning Post* entitled 'The Chance

of a Lifetime' concerning the Imperial Conference, 1 October 1923. Alludes to 'the complete equality and entire freedom' here in considering affairs but also mentions the 'pitiful lack of policy on the part of the host –the Imperial Government' in the past and states that the history of the conference 'shoes that from the beginning almost until now it has failed of great achievement principally because the British Government opposed its negative to every constructive proposal put forward by the Dominions.'
