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1 - Message from the Director

The UCD Centre for Japanese Studies (JaSt) was established in April 2020, and since then, JaSt, together with the UCD Japan Group (founded in 2016), has been proactively supporting the university to fulfil its multidisciplinary ambitions to increase and diversify its student/staff population through broader and deeper engagement with Japan and other Asian countries in critical areas of innovative research, education innovation, intercultural competence and employment. JaSt connects UCD's students, researchers and professional and academic staff with partners and key stakeholders (universities, research institutes and government bodies) in Japan, and the Japanese communities in Ireland and abroad. This is the third Annual Report. Together with the members of the Centre, I am immensely grateful to those who have been supporting our educational and research-led mission. I also would like to take this opportunity to thank the staff for their dedication and contributions to the Centre.

Important recent development

Ireland-Japan diplomatic links and Signing of Joint Statement August 2022

Ireland's longstanding strong diplomatic links with Japan (dating back to the 1950s) have gained new impetus from the 2018 launch of Global Ireland: Ireland's Global Footprint to 2025. This strategy represents the most ambitious renewal and expansion of Ireland's international presence ever undertaken in terms of diplomacy, culture, business, overseas aid, tourism and trade.

On the 20th July 2022, Taoiseach Micheál Martin TD and Japan's Prime Minister Fumio Kishida issued a Joint Statement, "Taking Forward Partnership with Shared Ambition".

The Joint Statement sets out the vision of both governments on strengthening bilateral relationships in agri-food, financial services, ICT, life sciences and clean technologies, research and all levels of Education. A significant increase in institution partnerships as well as academic and student mobility, is expected. Ireland's commitment to Japan is further evidenced by the decision to construct Ireland House in Tokyo, which is due to open in 2024, and the largest-ever capital investment by the Irish Department of Foreign Affairs. Ireland is also preparing its participation in Expo 2025 in Osaka. These flagship developments are also destined to strengthen Ireland's overall presence across the Asia Pacific region.

Current changing geo-political landscape

At European level, Japan's unique and historical strategic position in Asia is assuming increased significance at a time of rapid global geo-political shift. Relations were further strengthened with the signing of the EU/Japan High-Level Dialogue 25th October 2022). The projected growth of Asian economic dominance in the 21st century, despite some current deceleration, is still expected to remain strong. Japan's stable and successful political and economic system has a highly developed and innovative science and technology sector. Its education system includes some of the most elite university institutions in the world. Its ancient and rich cultural heritage is renowned and admired; more recently, innovation in the creative industries sector highlights Japan's status as a global cultural force.

UCD Japan approval to apply for Centre status

Recognising the importance of Japan in 2016, the then UCD President as Chair of ACCAC, supported the establishment of an academic-led, multidisciplinary **UCD Japan Group**. Its achievements (with scant resources) were strong across many areas. In April 2019, the two co-Chairs of the UCD Japan Group (Prof. Emma Sokell (Head of School, Physics) and Assoc. Prof. Naonori Kodate (School of Social Policy, Social Work & Social Justice)) met the then Registrar (subsequently Acting President Prof. Mark Rogers). He approved the proposal for a submission to establish a Centre of Excellence for 'Japanese Studies' on the basis of the Japan Group's track record.

UCD Centre for Japanese Studies (JaSt), established in April 2020.

The Academic Centre proposal included core Japanese Studies, covering a wide range of themes, including contemporary society, innovation, STEM, climate, design and technology, history and aesthetics (incl. architecture), food, music and sports, as well as Japanese language and culture (benchmarked to high international standards). The application was approved in April 2020.

Important note: This high-level academic approval does not imply a commitment for funding. Most JaSt activities are organised with generous support from the UCD Japan Group and the voluntary work of the UCD JaSt colleagues. Certain activities can receive targeted funding from Government Bodies, State Agencies, the Corporate Sector and other agencies.

Through establishing the Centre, we prepared ourselves as a National Hub for Education, Research and Innovation while highlighting UCD's commitment to long-lasting impacts/outputs in the area of Japanese studies/ and to Japan. A key priority is to heighten employability by enabling students to develop the intercultural communication, language and transferable skills required in a fast-changing world of business, research, public policy and diplomacy.

These developments are timely as Ireland is witnessing the unprecedented transformation in HE with the recent establishment of 5+ Technological Universities in every part of the country. The Minister for Further and Higher Education, Mr Simon Harris TD and his team have been proactively seeking new partnerships in the world.

Using our personal, individual and collective resources and research connections, JaSt has also been proactively supporting the university (including UCD Centre for English and Global Languages (CEGL) as well as UCD Global) to fulfil its ambitions to increase and diversify its student/staff population through broader and deeper engagement with Japan and other Asian countries in critical areas of research, intercultural competence and employment. JaSt offers advice and guidance for prospective UCD students in the world, and UCD students and researchers who are interested in and seeking friends and collaborators in Japan. It therefore provides visible and invisible support networks for UCD's students, researchers and professional and academic staff. JaSt sowed the seed and laid foundations for this university's partnerships with Japanese universities and research institutes during the period when the university had no clear strategy for Asia (apart from student recruitment). JaSt made it happen, because we believe in a vibrant academic-led, multidisciplinary team, respecting personal connections as well as institutional history, and understanding the meaning of partnerships. Students' needs drive us forward. Examples of its achievements are laid out in this Report.

This is the third Annual Report. Together with the members of the Centre, I am immensely grateful to those who have been supporting our educational and research-led mission. I also would like to take this opportunity to thank the staff for their dedication and contributions to the Centre.

2 - JaSt Centre Review

In accordance with UCD's policy on Academic Centres, all centres are subject to review during their third year of operation, and thereafter subject to periodic review based on a schedule determined by the Academic Council Committee on Academic Centres (ACCAC). Accordingly, JaSt underwent the review which took place between December 2022 and February 2023. The purpose of the review was to ensure that the Centre is meeting its objectives. The review outcome was published in March 2023. Below are the key observations, commendations and recommendations made by the Review Panel as conveyed by Prof. Alex Evans, Chair of ACCAC.

Here are the key observations, commendations and recommendations made by the Review Panel.

Observations

- Interesting and dynamic Centre.
- It is truly multidisciplinary.
- Successful two years since inception.
- Has done much to build the profile of Japanese research, language and culture in UCD, the profile of UCD in Japan with partners including universities, Japanese government and Irish embassy.

Commendations

- Excellent interdisciplinarity across the University.
- This Centre has demonstrated how various researchers and academics can come together in the university with a shared interest.

Recommendations

- Plans for coming 5 years are quite vague.
- Need to firm up Centre identity and ensure it becomes well-established.
- At the moment, much of the work is driven by a dedicated Director and it would prove beneficial to draw up a succession plan that includes the various areas across the University.

Post-doctoral Researchers & Visiting Researchers



Prof. Osaka joined us at the UCD Centre for Japanese Studies & the UCD Geary Institute for Public Policy in April 2022 and will stay till March 2024. Prof. Osaka is Associate Professor in Japanese politics at the Department of Political Science, Faculty of Law, Komazawa University, Tokyo and the Director of the Komazawa University Institute for Journalism and Policy Studies. Prof. Osaka gave lectures and seminars for UCD Japan Fair 2022 and the Gateways to Japan. He also wrote regularly for the website magazine called RONZA of the Asahi Shimbun newspaper, and one article touched upon the JaSt's activities as well as the EJ Taiko, and Experience Japan.



Dr Sekimoto, a specialist in Lymphangioleiomyomatosis (LAM), will be conducting research at the UCD Conway Institute. Dr Yasuhito Sekimoto (MD, PhD) joined a research team led by Assoc. Prof. Cormac McCarthy and Prof. Michael Keane at the UCD Conway Institute. Dr Sekimoto successfully applied for the DevelopMed Fellowship Program (Marie Skłodowska-Curie COFUND Action), which is a Precision Oncology Fellowship at UCD, with the aim of continuing basic research in Lymphangioleiomyomatosis (LAM). Dr Sekimoto contributed to the Gateways to Japan module, and is a member of the UCD Japan Group.



Dr Hiroaki Imoto, former PhD Student & JSPS funded researcher in Systems Biology at Osaka University, completed his PhD research, and returned to the laboratory of Prof. Boris Kholodenko (SFI Stokes Professor of Systems Biology at Systems Biology Ireland and UCD Conway Institute) in April 2023. The duration of his post-doctoral research is expected to be for 2 years.



Hayanon, a master of Japanese manga, holds a BA in Physics and Masters in English Education. She writes and illustrates comic strips about science topics such as auroras, global warming, cosmic rays and many more. These comics are mainly aimed towards children and non-scientists, though she has written for many audiences. Over the past twenty years, Hayanon has produced science comics for magazines, newspapers, universities (e.g. Kyoto, Tokyo, Hokkaido), research institutes, JAXA and NASA. Recently, she started working for cross-researchers working in arts, humanities and social sciences. Her works have been translated into more than 25 languages. She joined the UCD-JaSt as a visiting researcher / artist in April 2023.

5 - Japanese Studies: Language, Culture and Area Studies

5.1 - Japanese Language and Culture Modules [2012-2023] - Development and challenges


Japanese is a long-established curricular (Leaving Certificate) language in Irish secondary schools (first non-European language) and is taught in UCD for more than 30 years.

As the table below shows, UCD numbers and standards taking Japanese are on a downward trend. Proficiency achieved is entry level (mainly beginners CEFR A.1.1, so well below the Government CEFR B1 'independent user' target). Few students go 'up the levels'. Students with prior knowledge of Japanese, (for example Leaving Certificate) level cannot easily be accommodated,

The 'Free Choice Electives' curricular structure is the dominant teaching model/framework. This supports a generic, common approach to foreign language teaching, as shown on the website. Most modules are taught at beginners/entry-level only. Additional learning time and specific pedagogies are required to support students acquiring specific features of Japanese, for example culture or writing/reading, and these are not available.

Following UCD Curriculum Review and Enhancement (CRE) in 2017, the Free Choice Electives' structure was cut back, so fewer elective slots are available. The capacity to provide 'Japanese learning pathways' to enable students' progress 'up the levels' is proving challenging for many reasons. Yet demand is strong including the need to prepare students for growing mobility opportunities to Japan, including Study Abroad, internships etc.

The good news is that nationally, Japanese is now a targeted Asian language in the Irish Government's ambitious National 'Languages Connect' Strategy, 2017-26. It is also an increasingly sought-after language by International (EU and non-EU) and home students in UCD. Despite the challenges, JaSt has been proactively seeking to create an ecosystem for UCD students, working closely together with the UCD JSoc, Experience Japan and external bodies.

The university's Global Engagement Strategy, a major strand within the university strategy "Rising to the Future", seeks to open up ambitious opportunities to support all foreign language learning and move beyond current barriers to extend language learning options.

Japanese Language Proficiency Test (JLPT)

International certification for Japanese language proficiency is widely sought for personal, professional, academic or mobility purposes. The JLPT (Japanese Language Proficiency Test) is an internationally recognised qualification for non-native speakers sponsored by the Japan Foundation, a Japanese Government agency. The Japan Foundation requested JaSt to establish a JPLT National Examination Centre in 2017 and the administering of the examination has continued successfully since then. Candidates come from all over Ireland to take the exam but also from elsewhere in the British Isles or further afield.

In Ireland there is a strong candidate demand from secondary schools and HEIs to take the exam. As an interdisciplinary research Centre, this enables the unit to generate income to fund its activities, and the university status is enhanced as a Centre for learning Japanese language, culture, business and society in Irish Higher Education.

Government's 'Languages Connect' National Strategy collaboration with JaSt

At a time when the DES and DFHERIS are strongly supporting the teaching and learning of foreign languages, JaSt is being called upon to advise and support Japanese as part of the National 'Languages Connect' Strategy for Foreign Languages in Education 2017 to 2026. Its staff are invited to provide advice and expertise and to respond to specific demands to run Japanese Language & Culture teaching projects. The teaching of non-European languages and especially Asian is an important and developing field in Ireland, and there is much to be achieved. Part of the mission of the Japan Foundation is to support Japanese language teaching in Ireland, so the partnership between the Foundation and JaSt is a positive development.

5.2 - The Spirit of Samurai Taiko: EU-Japan Fest funded Cultural Project (March 2023)

As part of a highly successful Irish Schools Round Trip, 'Wadaiko Experience', Japanese Taiko drummers visited twelve secondary schools in Cork, Ennis, Wexford, Gorey and Dublin. A total of over 800 students, along with their teachers and school officials, not just experienced the excitement but also joined in and performed. Many of these schools already teach and plan to expand Japanese language and culture.

Another great highlight was the performance of Samurai Music Zi-Pang and the Dublin based Experience Japan Taiko team in a large, throbbing taiko ensemble over two days, Friday and Saturday at our national St. Patrick's Festival. The big outdoor stage for a number of performances (over 7,000 attendees) was perfect: a special setting in historic Collins Barracks, once used as a military facility, now a national museum. Once again, the performers and audience worked in a Samurai unison, drawing in the festival workers, food court workers, volunteers and many children.





6 - Summary of key activities

Most activities are organised with generous help from the UCD Japan Group and voluntary work of the UCD JaSt colleagues.

6.1 – Dr T.P. Hardiman Memorial Book Collection (September 2022)

Dr Tom P. Hardiman (awardee of the Order of the Rising Sun Gold Star, 1986) passed away in 2020, and almost exactly one year later, very sadly, his wife Rosaleen followed Dr Hardiman - Ar dheis Dé go raibh a hanam dílis.

Both Tom and Rosaleen loved Japan, Japanese culture and language, which was evidenced by their long-term dedication and contribution to developing Ireland-Japan relations, both formally and informally.

Their daughter, Prof. Niamh Hardiman (School of Politics and International Relations / JaSt Academic Advisor) got in touch with Assoc. Prof. Kodate, offering their collection of books on Japan and Lafcadio Hearn to the UCD Centre for Japanese Studies.

The bookcase is now located in the UCD School of Social Policy, Social Work and Social Justice (Hanna Sheehy Skeffington Building), and was shown to Prof. Hitoshi Ebishima (Seijo University / Japan-Ireland Association) when he visited the Centre in November 2022.

6.2 – Welcoming Mr Naoki Furukawa MP (House of Representatives, Japan) (September 2022)

Together with this year's Auditor of the UCD Japanese Society, UCD-JaSt members welcomed Mr Naoki Furukawa MP (House of Representatives) from Japan on Friday 2 September 2022 in the UCD Research (Impact Room).

Assoc. Prof. Kodate was contacted by the Embassy of Japan in Ireland, and asked to welcome a Japanese politician (a member of parliament and also a member of the Japan-Ireland Parliamentary Friendship League), who was visiting Ireland. The reason given was that the Centre is the most research active unit in Ireland (in the area of Japanese Studies).

Ireland's longstanding diplomatic links with Japan (dating back to the 1950s) are strong and have recently gained new impetus from the government's Global Footprint 2025 Strategy and of the challenges of Brexit. On the 20th of July 2022, Taoiseach Micheál Martin TD and Japan's Prime Minister Fumio Kishida issued a joint statement "Taking Forward Partnership with Shared Ambition", which outlines a roadmap to strengthening ties between Ireland and Japan over the next number of years.

The JaSt members (including our School's affiliated researchers and PhD student: Adjunct Prof. John Neary, Prof. Iwao Osaka, Nobuko Ijichi) outlined the activities and achievements of the Centre, and its future plans. Mr Furukawa's particular interest is in secondary and tertiary education in Ireland, and he had a meeting with senior officials at the Department of Education, while visiting a few secondary schools in North Dublin and Wexford during his three-day visit.

6.3 - Welcoming Professor Hitoshi Ebishima (Seijo University) (November 2022)

JaSt members welcomed Prof. Ebishima from Seijo University on 7 November 2022. This autumn, Seijo University under his leadership launched a brand new module entitled Introduction to Irish Studies. Prof. Ebishima's research interests include the GAA, and sport policy. His book chapters can be found in the following edited books: Japan, Sport and Society: Tradition and Change in a Globalizing World (Routledge, 2006, The Changing Face of Rugby: The Union Game and Professionalism since 1995 (Cambridge Scholar Publishing, 2008), and The Routledge Handbook of Sport in Asia (Routledge International Handbooks, 2020)

Seijo University has been a hub of the Irish Studies in Japan for many years, which Prof. Itaru Ueno (Prof. Emeritus, Seijo University, Economic History) established together with his colleagues. Furthermore, Prof. Bon Koizumi, great-grandson of Patrick Lafcadio Hearn and Director of the Lafcadio Hearn Memorial Museum (Matsue, Japan), is also a graduate of Seijo University, and he specialised in folklore studies.

Director of the UCD Centre for Japanese Studies, Assoc. Prof. Kodate visited Seijo University in Setagaya, Tokyo on 24 December 2019, just before the pandemic began. He met the then President of the University, Prof. Junichi Tobe, Prof. Kyoji Kawasaki, Prof. Ebishima and Prof. Komiyaji.

Since then, there have been several discussions as to our future collaborations. Our Discovery Module, Gateways to Japan, is a mirror image of their new Introduction to Irish Studies module. They have 100 students registered this year.

There is a lot of synergy between Seijo's four Faculties (Economics, Law, Arts & Literature and Social Innovation) and UCD's three Colleges (Arts & Humanities, Social Sciences & Law and Business), and no doubt our collaborations will continue.

6.4 - Visiting Scholar Programme, Japanese Ministry of Foreign Affairs

Dr Declan M. Downey (School of History), was a guest of Japan's Ministry of Foreign Affairs on its Visiting Scholar Programme from 5th to 12th March 2023. During this period, he conducted research for his next book-project concerning post-war Premier Yoshida Shigeru's foreign policy as well as on the embryonic Irish-Japanese diplomatic relationship in the Diplomatic Archives in Tokyo. Also, Dr Downey had high level briefings with senior diplomatic and academic experts in Keio University and in the University of Tokyo on current policy and practice concerning Japan's response to the emerging challenges of global security and stability. In addition, as part of Dr Downey's legal and historical interest in matters of territorial sovereignty, he visited the recently founded National Museum of Territory and Sovereignty in Tokyo where he was informed of issues concerning Japan's territorial integrity.

As part of his programme, Dr Downey was invited to the University of Kyoto to address academic staff and graduate students on 'Ireland's response to current changes in the geo-political situation (with specific reference to Eastern Europe & East Asia) and the challenges that they represent for Ireland and the European Union'.

Arising from Dr Downey's visit, the University of Hiroshima through its involvement with Hiroshima Peace Culture Foundation, has expressed interest in establishing formal institutional links with UCD, and furthering closer academic

cooperation and exchanges. Also, of noteworthy interest for UCD is the fact that one of Dr Downey's former students, Dr Mahon Murphy, a UCD alumnus, is now an associate professor in History in the Faculty of Law at the University of Kyoto. (Text contributed by Dr Downey.)

7 - Partnerships

7.1 - UCD Smurfit School of Business & Showa Women's University signs new MOU (March 2023)

Prof. Dolores O'Riordan (VP for Global Engagement) attended the signing ceremony of the MOU between Showa Women's University and UCD Smurfit School of Business. The MOU between SWU and UCD Smurfit School of Business was signed on the campus of Showa Women's University (SWU) in Setagaya, Tokyo on 7 March 2023.

The UCD delegation consisted of Professor Dolores O'Riordan (Vice President for Global Engagement), Prof. Don Breden (UCD Smurfit School of Business) and Ms Carol Deering (UCD Smurfit School of Business / former member of the UCD Japan Group). The MOU between SWU and UCD Smurfit School of Business was prepared over a period of time, and due to the pandemic, the signing ceremony was postponed a few times.

Prof. Mariko Bando (Chancellor) and Prof. Natsuko Kohara (President) welcomed the UCD delegation, together with the director and his team of the Center for International Exchange at SWU. The partnership resulted from JaSt's Centre Launch event in February 2021 with contributions from Prof. Christina Davis (Harvard University, JaSt Academic Advisor) (https://www.ucd.ie//newsevents/ucdcentreforjapanesestudieslaunchwebinarseries/).

In 2021, Prof. Bando gave a special talk entitled "Why Women Leaders?". Prof. Mariko Bando is a prolific author of more than 40 books, including *Toward a Gender-Equal Society* and *The Dignity of a Woman*, which has sold more than 3 million copies. After graduating from the University of Tokyo in 1969, she embarked on a path-breaking career that began as the first woman to be employed at the Japanese Prime Minister's Office as a career bureaucrat. In 1998 she became the first woman to serve as Japanese Consul General in Brisbane, Australia. From 2001-03, she was Director-General of the Bureau for Gender Equality under Prime Minister Junichiro Koizumi. Prof. Kohara (D.Eng., Tokyo Institute of Technology) has been the President of SWU since 2020, and is a woman pioneer in the area of fiber chemistry.

The history of Showa Women's University began in September 1920 with five instructors and eight students. SWU has grown into an educational institution with a kindergarten, elementary school, middle school, high school, university, and graduate school, where approximately 9,000 students study. Prof. Kenji Kaneko, the first president of SWU was a student in Lafcadio Hearn's English classes at Tokyo Imperial University, and published a book of his translations, Koizumi Yakumo zenshu, vol. 11 (『小泉八雲全集 第 11 巻 書簡集』(第一書房、1931 年)).

At the signing ceremony, Chancellor Bando generously gave Prof. O'Riordan a traditional Japanese doll as a sign of friendship.

7.2 - Existing JaSt Supported Partnerships

- Chiba University (CU) Several researchers from CU (nursing and engineering) have been working with Dr Kodate since 2016, and the MoU between CU and UCD was signed in 2017. Assoc. Prof. Kodate remains key researcher on several other ongoing projects, which include a tri-country collaborative project 'Caring Communities' led by Profs. Mina Ishimaru and Antoine Boivin (Montréal).
- Hokkaido University (HU) The Erasmus+ ICM 2022 Application was successful, and it is awarded to Assoc. Prof. Kodate (Social/Public Policy) and Prof. Gordon (One Health).
- International Christian University (ICU) 'Language Buddies' Program is continuing. One UCD student was selected as a winner of the JaSt-ICU scholarship competition to join the ICU's Japanese Language Summer School in July 2023. Smurfit School of Business visited ICU in March 2023 to discuss possible collaborations. This partnership with ICU has been nurtured and maintained by Mr Hugo O'Donnell and others for more than 20 years.

- Japan Rugby Football Union (JRFU) –Ms Ijichi helped the Smurfit School of Business recruit a student for their MBA programme, and continues to have close contacts with Ms Akane Kagawa and JRFU.
- Keio University (Keio) —Prof. Michito Tsusuoka (Associate Professor at Keio, based at the Faculty of Policy Management) visited Dublin and gave a talk entitled "Europe and East Asia in the Wake of the War in Ukraine" at the Institute of International and European Affairs (IIEA). Prof. Neary chaired and moderated the session (10 February 2023). Dr Downy on his visit to Japan met Prof. Tsuruoka in March 2023.
- Kyoto University (Kyoto) Dr Downey's former student, Dr Mahon Murphy, is now an Associate Professor in History in the Faculty of Law at Kyoto. Led by Dr Murphy and Prof. Mulligan (School of History), there was a plan of holding a seminar in UCD, welcoming a group of academics from Kyoto.
- Meiji University (MU) Discussion is ongoing regarding possible student collaborations between MU's Faculty of Commerce and UCD-JaSt. The Centre provided help and assistance for the Smurfit School of Business. JaSt members Ms Ijichi, Mr O'Donnell and Dr Kodate gave lectures for Prof. Yuri Matsubara's students in the Faculty of Commerce. Prof. Matsubara is a former colleague of Assoc. Prof. Kodate at the University of Tokyo.
- Osaka University (OU) –Dr Hiroaki Imoto returned to UCD to rejoin the Kholodenko Group in UCD's Systems Biology Ireland as a postdoctoral researcher. The original connections between Dr Imoto and JaSt were made between Prof. Mariko Okada (OU) and Assoc. Prof. Kodate.
- Seijo University (SU) A new module 'Irish Studies' (the initiative taken by Prof. Ebishima, inspired by JaSt's Gateways to Japan module in UCD) was launched at SU in 2022, and Assoc. Prof. Kodate gave a lecture. It was a very successful module (with 100 students registered) and will be run again in 2023 with Ambassador Damien Cole opening the series.
- Shiga University of Medical Science (SUMS) A new funded research project with the Toyota Central R&D Lab is co-led by Assoc. Prof. Kodate (UCD/EHESS) and Prof. Mayuko Tsujimura, together with Prof. Sébastien Lechevalier (EHESS). Assoc. Prof. Kodate has been giving a one-off guest lecture at SUMS in the last two years.
- Showa Women's University (SWU) Through Dr Kodate's personal contact, Chancellor Bando and Prof. Gerardine Doyle were introduced to each other back in 2020. The UCD delegation (led by Profs. O'Riordan and Bredin) visited the SWU campus for the signing ceremony. JaSt offered a scholarship to one UCD student through a competitive process for her participation in SWU's online Japanese language summer program.
- University of Electro-Communications (UEC) Prof. Sokell (School of Physics) has been working with Prof. Nakamura and colleagues at UEC over many years. Prof. Sokell was a member of the International Advisory Board, the 20th International Conference on the Physics of Highly Charged Ions, Matsue Japan (Aug-Sep., 2022).
- University of Hiroshima (UH) Prof. Hideki Kuwajima (through the introduction of Dr Katherine O'Donnell, School of Philosophy) visited UCD in 2017, and gave a talk on Lafcadio Hearn with Prof. Mary Gallagher. Intervarsity collaborations have been under discussion ever since between Prof. Kuwajima and Assoc. Prof. Kodate. Several online meetings were held to discuss possible projects in 2022. Through the Peace Foundation, Dr Downy is now exploring the possibility of working with them for JaSt and the UCD Centre for War Studies.
- Utsunomiya University (UU) A long-term partnership began with friendship and collaboration between Emeritus Prof. Gerry O'Sullivan (Physics) and Prof. Takeshi Higashiguchi. Profs. Sokell and Dunne are continuing the collaboration.

7.3 - Japan Rugby Football Union cooperation

Since 2016, the UCD Japan group has supported the Japan Rugby National team. In the academic year 2021-22, Ms Akane Kagawa from Japan Rugby Football Union came to study at the UCD Smurfit Graduate Business School. We want to congratulate Akane on completing her MBA and on her recent promotion to the board of JRFU. She is now leading on the new 'Women in Rugby' Strategic Plan 2021-25. With the strong person-to-person connection, the Centre for Japanese Studies continues to maintain good relationships with JRFU and supported the recent Japan National Team Under 19's visit in March. The historic series against the Irish National Under 19 team, saw Japan and Ireland win one match each in entertaining games at Terenure RFC. The Centre is happy to keep supporting these sporting links.

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
