Amphetamine:

Amphetamine is a psychoactive synthetic stimulant drug. It is also an active metabolite of Methamphetamine. There is no medicinal use for amphetamine in Ireland currently and there is no legal limit for amphetamine in the Irish Road Traffic Act.

Methamphetamine:

Methamphetamine is a psychoactive synthetic stimulant drug. It metabolises to the active metabolite of amphetamine and has a long half-life and duration of affect. There is no medicinal use for methamphetamine in Ireland currently and there is no legal limit for methamphetamine in the Irish Road Traffic Act.

Methylenedioxyamphetamine:

Methylenedioxyamphetamine (MDA) is chemically related to amphetamine and methamphetamine but is structurally different as it has a methylenedioxy group on the ring structure. There is no medicinal use for MDA in Ireland currently and there is no legal limit for MDA in the Irish Road Traffic Act.

Methylenedioxymethamphetamine:

Methylenedioxymethamphetamine (MDMA) is chemically related to MDA. MDA is a pharmacologically active metabolite of MDMA. There is no medicinal use for MDMA in Ireland currently and there is no legal limit for MDMA in the Irish Road Traffic Act.
