Entry Procedure:

MSAP – Ireland Assessment & Written Application (via CAO) + References

All elements must be completed.

In some cases short listed applicants may be invited for interview to facilitate a decision on an application.

The **MSAP – Ireland Assessment** is designed to allow you to demonstrate your skills in written English (Module 1) and your capacity for critical reasoning in the area of Humanities and Social Sciences (Module 2). The assessment takes two hours in total.

The only sitting of the MSAP-Ireland assessment in 2017 will take place on 4 March 2017. There will be no alternative assessment date.

Please ensure that you read this information carefully before making your application.

The **Written Application** allows applicants to explain their reasons for wishing to undertake a Law degree and detail their achievements to date.

Applicants must ensure that they tick the Mature Special Category on the CAO application form and complete sections 1-11 of the Mature Application section.

Evidence of maturity, commitment and potential is sought from the information you provide. The study of Law is a full time occupation and entry is conditional on your making a full time commitment.

Maths Recommendation:

A minimum grade 6 in Leaving Certificate Higher Level or minimum grade 3 in Leaving Certificate Ordinary Level (or equivalent) is recommended for DN610.
