Who is Graduate Diploma / MSc Healthcare (Acupuncture) for?

The programme is open to those with a primary degree in Healthcare e.g. medicine, physiotherapy, and nursing. A degree classification of 2:1 is required

What will I learn?

The 2 year part-time programme has been developed to teach Chartered Physiotherapists and other health professionals the theory and practice of acupuncture to internationally accepted standards. It provides healthcare professionals the opportunity to undertake postgraduate studies while continuing with their clinical work.

How will I benefit?

Completion of this programme provides education in traditional Chinese medicine that will equip the healthcare professional with the necessary skills to assess and treat a broad range of acute and chronic conditions.

What is the programme about

This programme aims to teach participants the theory of traditional Chinese medicine, which will enable them to assess and treat patients in a holistic manner

Features

The course will be delivered on a part-time basis over two years. Each semester will be run over approximately 12 weeks and will involve one full weekend (Saturday and Sunday). The theoretical basis of Traditional Chinese Medicine is taught along with clinical placements. Course modules will be assessed individually by differing combinations of in course assessment (ICA), written papers, and practical examinations. Upon successful completion of the taught modules a Postgraduate

Diploma will be awarded. Upon successful completion of the research dissertation, the MSc will be awarded.
