Creator Henry Morris (1874-1945)

Biographical History

Henry Morris or Enri O'Muirgheasa was born in Co. Monaghan. He was a teacher and subsequently a school inspector for the Department of Education. He was involved in the revival of Irish language, forming the Monaghan branch of the Gaelic League and was interested in antiquarian studies. He was a founder member of the Louth Historical and Archaeological society. He is best known for recording oral tradition and folklore in Irish in the Monaghan, Louth and south Armagh area during his lifetime. He was also a collector of 18th and 19th century Irish manuscripts. He was awarded an honorary MA from Queen's University Belfast in 1936.

Correspondence relating to Morris's antiquarian research, publication of material, his involvement in the Gaelic League and material relating to the recording of oral tradition. Correspondents include Padraig Pearse, who wrote to Morris in his capacity as the editor of *An Claidheamh Solais* regarding pieces Morris had written for the newspaper, and Irish Scholars such as Douglas Hyde, P.W. Joyce and J.H. Lloyd.

Morris Cor 5.5.14 - 19/1/1901

Relating to the publication by the Gaelic League/ Conradh na Gaedhilge of booklet by Morris. 'Printers are not wholly to blame for the delay in the publication of your booklet. ... It would never do to hurl Irish books at the head of the public in too rapid succession...'

Morris Cor 5.5.15 - 24.1.1901

Relating to the publication of a second booklet of stories by Morris by the Gaelic League.

Morris Cor 5.5.16 - 1/8/1901?

Relating to the publication of *Greann na Gaedhilge* and the prospect of Morris working on a booklet of Ulster proverbs.

Morris Cor 5.5.18 - 14/8/1901

Relating to the booklet on proverbs.

Morris Cor 5.5.20 - 22/10/1901

Relating to the second booklet of stories but warning Morris that there are three booklets that will be published before it by the Gaelic League.

Morris Cor 5.8.1 - 19/1/1901

Relating to the printing Greann na Gaedhilge (Part 2?)(In Irish)

Morris Cor 5.8.4 - 22/1/1902

Informing Morris that he is recommending that Morris be part of the Gaelic League publications committee. 'I imagine that the work will be of interest for you, and the northern element wants strengthening'.

Morris Cor 5.8.10 - 23/4/1902

Discussion on the merits of having a vocabulary at the end of Morris's book of Ulster proverbs and Pearse's acceptance that the book of Munster proverbs published by the committee should have had a vocabulary section.

Morris Cor 5.8.17 – 14/4/1902

Relating to the publication of *Greann na Gaedhilge* (Part 2).

Morris Cor 5.8.20 - 16/9/1902

Relating to the publication of *Greann na Gaedhilge* (Part 2) and the regulations of the publications committee. Also relating to the book on proverbs and it's going to the committee for approval.

Morris Cor 5.8.21 – 20/9/1902

Relating to the publication of *Greann na Gaedhilge* (part 2) which has been well received by the committee and welcoming Morris to the committee.

Morris Cor 5.8.22 – 2/10/1902

Pearse sending on the proof to *Greann na Gaedhilge* (part 2) and offering £4 for copyright which is the 'standard remuneration decided on for 16 – page booklets'.

Morris Cor 5.8.23 – 6/12/1902

Pearse agreeing to insert another story into the booklet, *Greann na Gaedhilge* (part 2), and relating to the layout of the cover.

Morris Cor 5.8.24 – No known date

Pearse explaining that inserting the other story would not be possible after all and suggesting that the story could go into Part 3 and that Mr Lloyd (J.H. Lloyd) made a few 'slight orthographical changes'.

Morris Cor 5.11.3 – No known date

Relating to Morris attending publication committee meetings and a review of *Greann na Gaedhilge* (Part 2) in *Celtica*.

Morris Cor 5.11.11 - 24/2/1903

Pearse seeking support from Morris for his application to be editor of *An Claidheamh Soluis*. Pearse says he is being 'actively and determinedly canvassed against'.

Morris Cor 5.11.13 - 22/2/1903

Statement from Pearse on the future of An Claidheamh Soluis if he were to be elected editor.

Morris Cor 5.11.33 – 14/?/1903

Asking Morris to provide information on Ulster for section on the provinces in An Claidheamh Soluis.

Morris Cor 6.2.2 – 18/2/1904

(In Irish, postcard)

Morris Cor 6.2.13 – 18/6/1904

Pearse saying he'll be there on the day of the Feile.

Morris Cor 7.2.3 – No known date

Pearse suggesting that the Gaelic League ignore the Leader 'as you are doing with the Democrat'.

Morris Cor 7.6.5 - 2/3/1906

Thanks for ???. (In Irish)

Morris Cor 7.6.27 – 15/11/1906

Apologies for not being able to attend and wishes Morris good luck with the lecture (?). In Irish

Morris Cor 8.2.1 - 3/1/1907

Relating to a review for *An Claidheamh Soluis* written by Morris. Pearse stressing that he wants it made clear that it is Morris view represented and not the editor's.

Morris Cor 8.2.28 - 28/9/1907

Relating to the publication of Seanfhocail Ulad. (In Irish).

Morris Cor 8.2.34 - 24/12/1907

Relating to the publication of Seanfhocail Uladh and its distribution?? (In Irish).

Morris Cor 8.5.1 - 15/01/1908

Relating to *Seanfhocail Uladh* and *Greann na Gaedhilge*, saying that Conradh na Gaedhilge has not got enough money at the moment to spend on publications, Pearse saying he'll send Morris a copy of his own book Toragan? (In Irish).

Relating to publications. (in Irish)

Morris Cor 8.5.3 - 19/02/1908

Relating to copies of Seanfhocail Uladh. (In Irish)

Morris Cor 8.9.40 - 12/12/1909

Letter from Pádraic Mac Piarais to [Annraoi Ó Muirgheasa]:stating that unfortunately An Claidheamh Solais cannot publish the manuscript he sent. He finishes by asking whether the manuscript should be returned to Annraoi or to another publisher who might publish it instead, dated 12th December 1909. (In Irish)

Saying here is '*Ceithearnach*,' Asking whether Dail Uladh was printed. Written on St. Enda's headed paper. (In Irish)

Morris Cor 9.1.5 – 26/4/1910

Relating to publications and meeting ?? On St Edna's headed paper. (In Irish)

Morris Cor 9.4.2 – 6/10/11

Fundraising for St. Enda's, giving those who 'identified themselves with the work of St. Enda's' a chance to contribute to the school. On St. Enda's headed paper.

Morris Cor 9.7.9 – 23/8/1912

Fundraising for St. Enda's following its voluntary liquidation.

Morris Cor 9.7.10 – 23/8/1912

Notice of an EGM of St. Enda's on 2nd September 1912.
