COURSE FEATURES

Develops knowledge and skills in Immediate Care with an emphasis on the assessment, diagnosis and management of both trauma and medical emergencies in adult and paediatric patients.

Multidisciplinary student groups: medical practitioners, nurses, paramedics and advanced paramedics.

Delivered over two years, this course uses a variety of learning strategies in recognition of the time constraints associated with full-time clinical practice.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

INTRODUCTION TO CORE COMPETENCIES

Year one of the course will introduce candidates to the core competencies required to manage medical and trauma emergencies in adults and children in the pre-hospital phase of care.

Core areas of anatomy, physiology, therapeutics and pharmacology for advanced pre-hospital care will be covered.

Special circumstances and research methods modules will also be delivered in year one. Knowledge of healthcare delivery systems and factors affecting the interface between services will be addressed.

CLINICAL PLACEMENT & DISSERTATION

The second year will consolidate learning from year one, and will include EMS placements involving the delivery of advanced pre-hospital care, development of critical appraisal skills and a research dissertation.

Candidates who choose to leave the course on successful completion of year one will be awarded a Professional Diploma in EMS.
