Regensburg: a Testimonial.



I went to Regensburg on Erasmus in 2001/2002. It was ten years ago but my experience there has had a positive effect on my life afterwards. Before going to Regensburg, I knew very little about the university or the city. The city is set in idyllic surroundings on the banks of the Danube. It is also within easy reach of Munich and Prague.

The university itself is, perhaps, not as aesthetically pleasing, sharing the same architect as our beloved UCD. However there is a very vibrant student life there with plenty of opportunities to meet new people. A large percentage of the city's population are students which gives the place a very lively feel and also means the bars and restaurants are generally not too hard on the pockets.

Most importantly, my stay in Regensburg not only inspired me to pursue a career in history, it gave me the necessary linguistic tools for my research.
