


Discovering our Past

Archaeological Research Seminar 2008



UCD School of Archaeology's Research Seminar aims to communicate knowledge about the School's wide-ranging international and national research projects in 2008.

UCD Archaeology staff and students are engaged in archaeological research projects around the world; in SE Asia, the Mediterranean and northwest Europe, ranging in date from the Mesolithic to the Post-medieval period.

UCD School of Archaeology has three major Research Themes each comprised of active Research Groups undertaking a range of projects. The seminar papers are arranged in sessions according to these themes: **Footprints of Ireland** (chair: Prof. Gabriel Cooney), **Landscape and Environment** (chair: Dr Aidan O'Sullivan) and **Materialising Identities** (chair: Prof. Muiris O'Sullivan).

This year, the seminar will mostly focus on externally-funded (e.g. INSTAR, RIA Committee for Archaeology, Heritage Council grants, IRCHSS, etc) research projects, but there will also be lectures on UCD-funded projects and Post-doctoral scholarships (e.g. John Hume Institute). Staff and postgraduate research project posters will also be on display.

All UCD School of Archaeology staff, PhD, MLitt and MA students will be present along with representatives of our funding authorities and our external collaborators and colleagues in the profession.
