About Barry Raftery:

Professor Barry Raftery was a respected Irish archaeologist with a long and distinguished career. He held the post of Professor of Celtic Studies in UCD until his retirement in 2007. Prior to this, he was the Professor of Archaeology, also at UCD. He had a number of areas of interest, in particular wooden trackways and associated features. Prof. Raftery led the excavation of what is now known as the Corlea Trackway in the 1980s. The findings of this were published in 1996 as 'Trackway Excavations in the Mountdillon Bogs 1985-1991'.

Prof. Raftery sadly passed away in August 2010, leaving behind an impressive legacy and contribution to archaeology in Ireland.


