

Studying Abroad – Exchange Opportunities in 2018-19 for

UCD Agriculture and Food Science students:

Students can study abroad for one semester at the following universities:

Students can spend either the 1st or 2nd semester of Stage 3 (third year) at a University abroad. *

ACP & FAM students can apply for semester 1 only.

We require students to take the equivalent of 20 - 30 UCD credits of coursework.

Depending on PWE period/semester 2.

There is no tuition fee at the University abroad but you need to register with UCD as usual and pay the normal UCD registration fee.


Basis of Selection:

Timeline for studying abroad in 2018/19

- 25th October 2017 Internal Application Applications open
- 27th November 2017 Internal Application Application Deadline
- Nominations of students to study abroad in semester 1 or 2 of 2018/19 will be made after the provisional results are published on 24th January 2018

FAQs

- How many course credits should UCD students take while abroad? 12-15 U.S. credits (equivalent to 30 UCD credits); Minimum of 4 courses at Queensland / Lincoln (equivalent to 30 UCD credits). Subject to approval of programme option (major) co-ordinator.
- What "Level" U.S. courses should you take? 100 level courses – 1st year (freshman) 200 level courses – 2nd year (sophomore)
 >300 level courses – 3rd year (junior) 400 level courses – 4th year (senior)
- What "Level" courses should you take in Australia/New Zealand?
 >300 level courses 3rd year
- What are the dates of semesters in the U.S.? Semester 1: ~20 August – 20 December Semester 2: ~ 10 January – 10 May
- What are the dates of semesters in Australia/New Zealand?
 Semester 1: ~ February July
 Semester 2: ~ July end of November

- If I take a semester abroad can I do PWE abroad too? If the student complies with the UCD PWE requirements, it may be possible to complete PWE abroad. Students need to liaise with their UCD PWE Co-ordinator.
