Architecture & Planning Study Abroad Programme

Includes programmes in Landscape Architecture and Environmental Policy

The UCD Study Abroad Programme in Architecture, Landscape Architecture, Planning and Environmental Policy offers visiting students the opportunity to be part of long-standing professional programmes, with Architecture dating back to the early 20th century and having celebrated 100 years of Architecture Excellence in 2011/12; and Planning celebrating their 50th anniversary in 2016.

The courses are all professionally accredited by their respective institutes. Architecture is the only school in Ireland accredited by both the Royal Institute of Architects of Ireland (RIAI) and the Royal Institute of British Architects (RIBA); it is currently in the process of seeking Substantial Equivalency Status from the National Architectural Accrediting Board (United States). Landscape Architecture Programme is accredited by the Irish Landscape Institute (ILI) and recognised by the International Federation of Landscape Architects (IFLA Europe). Planning is accredited by the Irish Planning Institute (IPI) and the Royal Town Planning Institute (RTPI).

Module Information and Assessment

At UCD we call classes/courses 'modules'. Details of modules are available to browse on UCD's online course catelogue at www.ucd.ie/students/course_search.htm.

Study abroad students have access to the full range of undergraduate modules available at UCD* (* subject to capacity and timetabling). You can register for up to four modules in your subject area and up to two modules from other programme areas. You may also take all of your modules within your chosen subject area.*

Assessment is based on a combination of in-semester components such as projects, class based assignments and formal examinations which take place at the end of each semester in December and May.

The School's modules offer
Study Abroad students excellent
opportunities to enhance their
knowledge in all related fields from
technical (Architectural Technologies,
Structures, Geographic Information
Systems, Environmental Sciences)
to substantive (Architectural
History & Theory, Ecology,
Conservation, Planning & Society,
Local Development) and managerial
(Professional Studies). Study Abroad
students may also gain studio
experiences in design, plan-making
or sustainable development.

The studios lie at the heart of the School's teaching. In line with the School's overarching aim of producing outputs that are sensitive to the local and broader societal context, the studio courses invite students to engage with the various frameworks within which a project takes shape and could be accomplished.

Study Abroad students have the opportunity to choose from several studio modules: 15-ECTS Design Studio module for students from Architecture Programmes; 10-ECTS Local Planning studio for students from accredited planning schools and one of several Landscape Architecture studios which occur at every level of the curriculum. The students would have a wide and varied choice of lecture-based modules across the School.

Students may also have the opportunity to take part in field trips to European cities.

Programme Supports

The UCD Architecture & Planning Study Abroad Programme has a dedicated administrator, who works with the UCD Centre for Study Abroad to help make student admission, registration and participation a smooth, efficient and enjoyable process.

Peer Mentors

All incoming Study Abroad students will be linked with a peer mentor who is a second or third year UCD student. Where possible, we try to assign peer mentors who have had a similar experience studying abroad and will be able to understand the needs and aspirations of Study Abroad students.

Academic Mentors

The UCD School of Architecture, Planning & Environmental Policy has a dedicated academic staff member who mentors the Study Abroad students.

Credit Transfer

UCD will send an official transcript of exam results to your home institution. Your home institution decides on credits to be awarded for modules pursued at UCD.
