Academic Research Centres

The UCD School of Nursing, Midwifery and Health Systems is unique among Irish nursing and midwifery schools in having two academic centres dedicated to the development of focused programmatic research in distinct fields:

- The National Centre for the Protection of Older People is conducting new groundbreaking research in the area of elder abuse and is already informing national social policy in recognizing at-risk older people, raising awareness about elder abuse and protecting older people from the risk of maltreatment.
- The UCD Irish Centre for Nursing and Midwifery History is an academic research centre, which has developed a programme of research examining aspects of the history of our professions in Ireland.

Assessment

Assessment is based on a combination of in-semester components such as, projects, term papers, clinical assessments and formal examinations. Study abroad students are expected to undertake all assessments in accordance with University regulations.

Credit Transfer

Students are advised to seek approval for modules before enrolling in UCD. At the end of the semester, UCD will send an official transcript to the home institution. Your home institution will decide on credits to be awarded for modules pursued in UCD. We will be pleased to provide full information on our modules to enable institutions to make decisions regarding the transfer of credits.

The grading system at UCD is European. It is quite different from North American schools. At UCD A,B,C are honors grades. D is a pass grade.

Eligibility

The minimum GPA is 3.00.

As part of the UCD on-line application process you are required to upload your transcript, a letter of recommendation from an academic referee and a copy of your passport.
