UCD has won over €465 million in research contracts over the last 5 years. A national bibliometric study has indicated that UCD's Impact rating has increased by 23% (1998-2002 to 2003-2007), with the number of publications has risen by 36% ((1998-2002 to 2003-2007) (FORFAS and HEA Bibliometric Study, 2009) UCD plays a leading role in pioneering knowledge transfer (Nova 2004-2010), with: €3.6 million generated from commercialisation of research invention disclosures 16 new UCD spin-outs incorporated > 300 invention disclosures > 200 Patent applications > 400 Industry collaborations UCD's major strategic research themes are: Earth Sciences, Energy and Environment Global Ireland Health and Healthcare Delivery Information, Computation and Communications UCD has a major contractual track record in successive EU Framework Programmes: UCD currently has 145 EU FP7 contracts, with an additional 14 in UCD has a 23% success rate in EU FP7 participation - the FP7 average success rate is 21% UCD has a 23% success rate in EU FP7 Marie Curie participation – the FP7 average success rate is 29% UCD is currently managing 45 Marie Curie awards, with 5 additional Marie Curies in negotiation.
