Brian Motherway – CEO, SEAI Keynote Speaker

Dr. Brian Motherway was appointed Chief Executive of the Sustainable Energy Authority of Ireland (SEAI) in May 2012. SEAI is Ireland's national energy authority with a mission to play a leading role in transforming Ireland into a society based on sustainable energy structures, technologies and practices. Brian was previously Chief Operations Officer and Head of Strategy at SEAI. He holds Bachelors and Masters degrees in Engineering from UCD and a PhD in Sociology.



Anne O'Leary – CEO, Vodafone Ireland Connecting our Digital Future

Anne O'Leary was appointed CEO of Vodafone Ireland in February 2013. Anne joined Vodafone from BT Ireland where she was Managing Director for six years and was previously Regional Director with Esat Telecom. She was recently re-elected to the Board of Dublin Chamber of Commerce. A Cork native, she also serves on the Board of Cork University Foundation. In her role, Anne has committed to investing in Ireland's telecommunications infrastructure resulting in Vodafone's nationwide rollout of 4G. She is also overseeing Vodafone's joint venture with the ESB, SIRO, which will result in the rollout of high speed fibre broadband across Ireland.
