

Ireland

Ireland is an island to the west of Great Britain and Europe. The island is divided into two parts — the Republic of Ireland and Northern Irland, part of the UK. The population is approximately 4.5 million people. Ireland is a member of the EU and is a Eurozone member country.

Ireland has **one of the best education systems in the world** according to the independent IMD World Competitiveness Yearbook 2009 (ranks 8th). This has allowed Ireland's small open economy to achieve deep integration within the world economy. Almost one thousand overseas companies use Ireland as their European base including Google, Intel, Yahoo, Adobe, Microsoft, Hewlett Packard, Apple and Amazon.com. There are excellent air links to European capitals and flight time to London is approximately 1 hour.

It is well known for its stunning scenery and varying landscapes – from rugged coastlines, to inland lakes and rivers, to impressive mountains and flat pasture farmland. In 2008 and 2010, it was voted by Lonely Planet as the friendliest country in the world!

Dublin

Dublin, capital of Ireland, traces its origins to 988 AD. With its wide streets and gracious architecture, Dublin is a historical and contemporary cultural centre for the island of Ireland as well as a modern centre of education, the arts, administrative function, economy and industry.

West of the city is the Phoenix Park, the largest enclosed park in Europe. To the **south**, and easily accessible by public transport, some of the most beautiful scenery in the country can be experienced in County Wicklow. To the **north** of the city is Dublin's international airport, which provides a gateway to the capital cities of Europe and the rest of the world.

University College Dublin

Established in 1854, University College Dublin is the largest and most international of Ireland's universities. UCD has a student population of over 24,000. There are more than 4,500 International students, about 20% of the total student body.

The university provides a wide range of degrees in subjects grouped into five Colleges: Arts and Celtic Studies, Business and Law, Human Sciences, Life Sciences and Engineering, Mathematical and Physical Sciences.

Research

Undergraduate courses at UCD offer a wide level of flexibility and choice, while equipping students with broad-based skills, and offering clear career and graduate pathways.

There is an extensive range of taught **Masters** programmes across all of the colleges – many of which are one year in duration.

The **Structured PhD programme** aims to enable UCD PhD students to achieve the best possible experience of graduate research and training. Making a substantial and original contribution to knowledge, normally leading to peer-reviewed publications, remains the core objective of doctoral studies. The Structured PhD includes several innovative measures designed to support students in achieving academic and professional objectives.

Research

UCD has an excellent track record in attracting external funding for research projects. In the last four years, the amount of funding awarded has more than doubled to €114.7 million and the level of proposals has increased two-fold.

International Student Centre
