Understanding your Certificate

The Certificate programme is intended for managers, supervisors, safety representatives and others who have some responsibility for safety and health at work or those with an interest in safety and health in the workplace. The programme is an introduction to all aspects of safety and health at work. This is a blended learning programme, delivered in online and face-to-face formats, with comprehensive learning materials. It is delivered between September and May.

Admission requirements

- Students will normally be working while undertaking the programme.
- Successful applicants will have a minimum of a good level of upper secondary education, be able to write reports and have reasonable computer literacy.
- Applicants whose first language is not English must also demonstrate English language proficiency of IELTs 7.0 (no band less than 6.5 in each element), or equivalent.
- If you can click on and watch the e-learning sample lecture on our webpage http://www.ucd.ie/cshw/, then your system is suitable for the programme.
- Places are offered on a first-come, first-served basis.

Mapping your Certificate

- This is a one-year, part-time multi-disciplinary Certificate programme.
- The programme is mapped at level 7 on the NQAI (National Qualifications Authority of Ireland) framework and level 1 UCD.
- It is an introduction to a comprehensive range of topics relating to safety and health in the workplace including: legislation; risk and safety management; identification of physical, chemical, psycho-social, and ergonomic hazards; occupational health hazard management and occupational safety hazard management.
- Lectures are given by leading experts in each topic, from various Schools and Colleges within UCD and other universities, the Irish Health and Safety Authority and public and private sector industries.
- This programme will be of interest to individuals and to large companies/organisations who wish to train a cohort of employees, managers and/or supervisors to a consistent standard.

Each module is assessed by assignment and/or examination. Students who successfully complete the requirements of all modules will be awarded a Certificate.

Blended learning

Learning takes place through an engaging blend of asynchronous online lectures, attendance in UCD for workshops, and online interaction activities. The online lectures are made available weekly and are supported by pre-lecture and post-lecture learning activities.

Commitment required of students

- Students are expected to participate in all learning activities. The first day of the 2016-17 programme will be September 23rd 2016. Other UCD attendance dates are provided below and students are required to be available to participate in all of them.
- Students will view a weekly E-lecture (about 1.5 hours) at a time that suits them (asynchronous).
- Students will also be required to engage with pre-lecture and post-lecture learning activities which will take a number of hours each week.
- Personal study time, to complete the assignments and meet the learning outcomes of the programme, varies for different individuals. Past students average 2-3 hours per week.

Career opportunities

Students who successfully complete the UCD Certificate in Safety and Health at Work will be able to advise management on a range of OSH issues in their workplace. The UCD Certificate in Safety and Health at Work is accredited by the UK Institution of Occupational Safety and Health (IOSH). Students successfully completing the programme will meet the IOSH academic requirements for Associate Membership and Technical Membership. Applicants for membership will also need to be able to demonstrate five years pre and/or post-course experience at an appropriate level in health and safety practice. English language requirements

• If your first language is not English and your primary qualification was obtained in a country where English is not the

official language of instruction, you must provide proof of proficiency in English such as IELTS or TOEFL.

- The original certificate of completion of an English language test must be submitted with the application.
- For IELTs (International English Language Testing System Academic): a minimum overall band score of 7.0 is required with a result not less than 6.5 in each of the individual sections.
- For TOEFL (Test of English as a Foreign Language): Internet Based Test: a minimum total score of 100 out of 120 is required, with a score not less than 22 in Reading and Listing, not less than 26 in Speaking and not less than 24 in the test of written English.
- For the Paper Based Test: A minimum total score of 600 is required with a score not less than 5.0 in the test of Written English.
- Test results must not be more than 2 years old.
