These events explore the social spirit and pulse of the city through educational programmes, community activities, social inclusion and city regeneration projects.

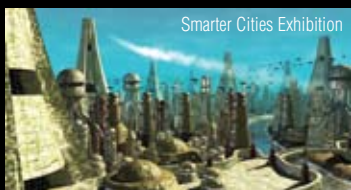
