CoBiD-UREKA

This summer, 10 international students will work one-on-one with a professional research mentor. CoBiD-UREKA is funded by Science Foundation Ireland and includes participation by mentors from the National Museum of Ireland, UCD School of Biology & Environmental Science, UCD School of Geology, and the National Botanic Gardens.

Students must apply to work with a specific research lab group. Detailed project descriptions are available online. Research groups in 2009 include:

*BioControl – Plant genomics – Limnology – Soil ecology
Palaeontology – Marine invertebrates – Ecological modelling*

Students must be currently registered undergraduates; have excellent English language skills; be proactive and dedicated to their work; demonstrate a strong interest in the research project in their application; and have further career goals in organismal biology.
