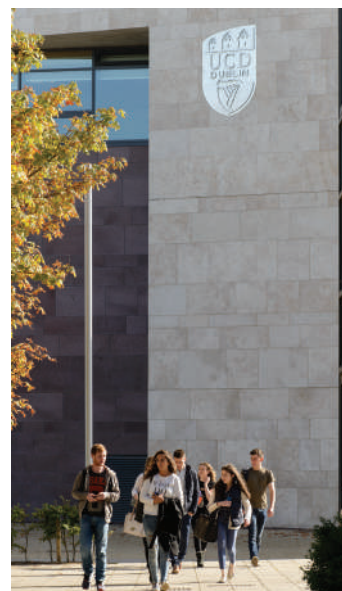
3 x10 credits

### Modules:

- Food Regulation (FDSC40740) – Autumn Trimester
- Science and Standards of Food Safety (FDSC40730) – Spring Trimester
- Food Risk Analysis (FDSC40720) – Summer Trimester

For each 10 credits module students are expected to undertake about 250 hours of work including online learning and independent learning activities.

Each module includes an assignment which will give you the opportunity to showcase your learning, development and appreciation of the issues involved.





## Online Programme - How will I learn?

This programme is delivered through the UCD online Platform (Brightspace) and will consist of online lectures, videos, interactive learning, discussion boards and virtual classroom environments.

A repository of resources will be available to support your learning and as a UCD student you will have full access to the library. Tutorials are delivered during each module and there will also be interviews with guest speakers from the world of food safety and regulatory science.
