Pre-Sessional English for Academic Purposes (EAP) Programme

UCD's Centre for English and Global Languages provides a range of academic English language programmes for students who wish to improve their academic and language skills before commencing a UCD undergraduate or graduate programme.

The Pre-Sessional EAP Programme is suitable for students who:

- Need to improve their language skills as a condition of entry to their UCD degree programme.
- Have already met the English language conditions for entry
 but wish to improve their proficiency and acclimatise to life and study at UCD before the academic year begins.

Choosing the Right Course

The length and type of course you need will depend on your current level of English, and the language requirements for your chosen degree programme here in UCD. Our experienced team can advise applicants based on their individual profile and requirements.

Course Aims:

- Develop students' English for Academic Purposes skills so that they are confident in using English at university level.
- Develop students' academic communication, independent study and research skills.
- Develop students' learner autonomy so that they can undertake independent study and research for academic programmes.
- Introduce students to Irish culture and life at UCD in preparation for studying in Dublin.

HOW WILL I LEARN?

Classes are taught by highly qualified tutors through small groups, lectures, seminars and tutorials.

This is an intensive course, and students are expected to engage in guided self-study in the form of homework and assignments; such independent learning forms an essential element of this course.

COURSE CONTENT

A typical study week will include:

- 20+ hours of class per week (morning and afternoon)
- Academic reading and writing
- Listening and note-taking skills
- Oral discussion practice and presentation skills

- Critical thinking and research skills
- Social and cultural activities
- Collaborative projects and peer learning
- Individual and group tutorials

COURSE ASSESSMENT

Students are tested on entry and on a regular basis throughout the course. Ongoing feedback is provided. At the end of the course, there will be a final assessment: this includes a written examination, a written research project on a relevant academic subject with an accompanying oral presentation. A transcript of final results on the student's English language competence will be forwarded to the UCD Degree Programme to which the student is applying.
