### **Scholarship Scheme 2024/2025**

**2 Non-EU Scholarships** (awarding 50% of the tuition fee for 2024/2025, September Start)

**2 EU Scholarships** (awarding 50% of the tuition fee for 2024/2025, September Start)

The **UCD Centre for English and Global Languages** will be offering **4 competitive Scholarships** (for **2 full-time EU students and for 2 full-time Non-EU students**) who will study on the **MA in TESOL full-time** in the academic year **2024/2025** (September start only). The scholarships will cover **50% of the 2024/2025 tuition fees** and will be awarded on merit.

#### **Who is Eligible to Apply?**

In order to be eligible to apply for this advertised scholarship, applicants must have an offer on the MA full time.

#### **How to Apply?**

Interested applicants should submit a **personal statement** (max. 500 words) outlining their commitment to language teaching and excellence in teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages. Please also describe how the scholarship would impact on your future career in the area of TESOL.

Candidates must submit the **Scholarship Application Form** which includes the personal statement by e-mail specifying the scheme for which they are applying i.e. Application for **MA TESOL Scholarship (Non-EU)** or **MA TESOL Scholarship (EU)**.

## Criteria

The TESOL Scholarship Selection Committee will review all applications based on the following criteria:

- Proven Excellence in Teaching English to Speakers of Other Languages
- Academic suitability to TESOL Programme and Commitment to Scholarship
- Impact of TESOL Scholarship on future career

Decisions will be made by the Scholarship Committee and candidates will be notified within two weeks of the committee decision. It is the student's responsibility to formally accept the scholarship offer **by return e-mail**. A non-response will be considered as declining the offer.

## Terms & Conditions

- 1) The Scholarship Program is funded by UCD **Centre for English and Global Languages** and aims to attract excellent candidates to the UCD's MA TESOL Programme and encourage early application
- 2) For one year Masters Programmes, the scholarship will cover the awarded amount against one year of tuition fees.
- 3) In order to be eligible to apply for this advertised scholarship, applicants must have 'Offer', 'Conditional Offer', 'Accept' or 'Conditional Accept' status associated with their application
- 4) Scholarship awards are applicable to the full time MA TESOL programme only
- 5) Scholarships are open to self-funding candidates
- 6) Successful candidates will be selected on merit paired with a holistic review of their scholarship application
- 7) Only complete applications received before **3 May 2024, 4pm (Irish time) will be considered**
- 8) Decisions will be made by the Scholarship Committee and candidates will be notified within two weeks of the committee decision
- 9) This scholarship is not eligible to be combined with any other tuition scholarship
- 10) Students awarded a scholarship are expected to attend UCD Open Events where required. Students are expected also to agree to join the Student Ambassador Panel and provide testimonials, or podcasts on their experience at UCD where required
- 11) A student who withdraws, cancels or becomes inactive, enrolls less than full-time, is suspended, or dismissed from the University will lose his/her scholarship eligibility. A student who takes such a status due to medical reasons (or other approved extenuating circumstances) may appeal in writing to the Scholarship Committee to have his/her scholarship reinstated. The appeal must be submitted with supporting documentation, such as a letter from a doctor. In such a case, for there to be a possibility for reinstatement, a student's leave from the University cannot exceed two consecutive semesters
- 12) A student who declines an initial offer of admission and accompanying scholarship offer will not retain his/her scholarship offer if he/she reapplies at a later date
- 13) Scholarships are non-transferable and will only apply to the programme associated with the offer letter that contains the scholarship award
