# University College Dublin



University College Dublin (UCD) is one of Europe's leading research-intensive universities where undergraduate education, graduate masters and PhD training, research, innovation and community engagement form a dynamic continuum of activity.

The University was established in 1854 by St John Henry Newman, whose classic work 'The Idea of a University' is one of the most enduring texts on the value of higher education. His vision, 'True enlargement of mind', embodies the aspiration to provide a holistic experience and inspiring environment beyond the classroom. It is a rallying call for the University and its community to unleash the unique potential of the individual to meet global challenges and "to benefit the wider world".

Today UCD is Ireland's largest university with over 33,000 students. Irish school-leavers benefit from the highly innovative and flexible UCD Horizons undergraduate curriculum. As Ireland's leader in graduate education UCD has almost 10,000 graduate students.

In Ireland, UCD is home to over 8,500 international students and delivers programmes to almost 4,000 students on overseas campuses. In addition, the University places great emphasis on the internationalisation of the Irish student experience – preparing all UCD students for future employment and life that crosses borders, boundaries, and cultures.

Originally known as the Catholic University of Ireland, the University became UCD in 1908 and is a constituent college of the National University of Ireland (NUI). In 1997, UCD became an autonomous university within the loose federal structure of the NUI, and UCD students are awarded degrees from the National University of Ireland.

UCD has been a major contributor to the making of modern Ireland. Many UCD students and staff participated in the struggle for Irish independence and the University has produced four Irish Presidents and five Taoisigh. Among UCD's well-known alumni are authors (Maeve Binchy, Roddy Doyle, Emma Donoghue, Flann O'Brien), former European Commissioner (Peter Sutherland SC), directors (Neil Jordan, Jim Sheridan) and sports stars (Brian O'Driscoll, Kevin Moran, Rena Buckley and Paul O'Donovan). Perhaps the best known of all is the writer James Joyce, who completed his Bachelor of Arts at the University in 1902.

Urquhart, Jane

Jane Urquhart is an internationally acclaimed author of eight novels and several books of poetry. Her work has garnered numerous prestigious literary awards.

Her relationship with UCD began in 2014 with a reading of her work. In February 2016, she once again gave a public reading and interview for students and the public. In 2017/18, Urquhart was appointed as the Craig Dobbin Chair of Canadian Studies at UCD. During her tenure she taught two modules, 'Introduction to Canadian Studies' and 'Narratives of Migration', and also gave guest lectures in Creative Writing in the UCD School of English, Drama and Film. Urquhart represented UCD around the country giving a number of readings and talks.

Working with Dr Paul Halferty, Director of the UCD Centre for Canadian Studies, she coorganised

'Imagining Home', an event in 2018 that explored the literary connections between Canada and Ireland and included internationally acclaimed authors Margaret Atwood, John Banville and Anne Enright.

Beyond the work she has done at UCD, is the huge contribution Urquhart has made to fostering connections between Ireland and Canada in her literary and other works. No other Canadian author has done more to excavate the deep connections that exist, especially in her work on migration and on the lives of the Irish diaspora in Canada.

Jane Urquhart has spent part of every year for the last thirty years in Ireland.

Her published works include: *The Whirlpool,* Away, The Underpainter, Booker Prize nominated The Stone Carvers, A Biography of Lucy Maud Montgomery, A Number of Things; Stories of Canada told through 50 Objects, The Night Stages, and she will publish her new work of fiction In Winter I Get Up at Night in 2024.
