Professional Diploma in Educational Leadership

(One Year Part-Time, Blended)

Introduction

The Professional Diploma in Educational Leadership (PDEL) is primarily aimed at teachers in the Irish education system. Programme participants are required to have some teaching experience and will be motivated to fulfil formal and informal leadership positions as well as to challenge the way they think about their work in a variety of ways. The concept of leadership employed is broad and can be applied to teachers at different stages of their career within schools as organisations. The programme draws on a wide-ranging international literature to focus on contemporary policy, practice and leadership challenges and opportunities. The programme is delivered through a blend of online sessions and on-campus days and is intended to provide a dynamic and transformative learning experience for all students. We are committed to developing our students' critical voice through reading, discussion, peer learning, presentations and critical review. These participative learning experiences have been tried and tested by us and ensure that high quality learning experiences and outcomes are realised.

Programme Structure and Content

The PDEL is a 30-credit programme taken over one academic year part time. The modules undertaken include a blend of some face-to-face sessions and weekly online sessions. The online sessions embrace the flipped classroom whereby learning materials, including assigned reading, talking heads/ videos and focus questions, are made available electronically in advance of the weekly discussion forum in the virtual classroom. Our experience is that the combination of on-campus days and online teaching and learning provides a dynamic and transformative learning experience for all students

Modules:

In the Autumn Trimester, students take two 10-credit modules, namely:

- Contemporary Issues for school leadership
- Leadership for Quality Learning

In the Spring Trimester, building on learning associated with the previous modules undertaken, students complete a 10-credit module entitled:
