SUMMER PROGRAMMES



BUSINESS SUMMER INTERNSHIP PROGRAMME

For business or business-related major students with at least one year of study completed. The UCD Lochlann Quinn School of Business Summer Internship is an **eight-week programme** combining academic, experiential and cultural elements into a holistic curriculum designed to ensure the student has the most engaged, international experience possible. Two weeks of intensive academic courses and a six-week internship placement at a leading Irish or multinational company. The intensive academic component consists of two courses; one core and one elective. The core course is Ireland's International Business Environment. The elective course options include: Global Sustainable Finance, and Responsible Management, Sustainability and Society.

Week 1-2: Orientation & intensive academic courses

Week 3-8: Professional Internship placement in Dublin

HEALTH SCIENCES SUMMER SCHOOL

This programme has two options which consist of a **two week taught tuition period and an option to spend a further two weeks** when students will work in small groups with a mentor who has experience and knowledge of a critical component of the evidence based healthcare process including: Clinical Audit, Lean Methodology, Clinical Research Centres, Systematic Review and Clinical Trials Methodology.

Week 1-2: Orientation, Taught Classes, and UCD's cultural-social programme on UCD campus.

Week 3-4: Mentor led group work to facilitate active student engagement with reflection on the complex processes and mechanisms by which evidence is translated into healthcare practice.

ENGINEERING LAB SUMMER SCHOOL

The UCD School of Chemical & Bioprocess Engineering was established in 1952 and is the oldest, largest, and highest ranked school of its kind in Ireland. The school will run a 4-week Unit Operations and Bioprocess Lab Summer School in June.

Students will work in groups of 2 to complete 8 Unit Operation and Bioprocessing experiments (assessment through written and oral reports). In the final week students will visit a pharmaceutical plant to get a close-up view of bioprocessing and large molecule manufacturing. 2-WEEK SUSTAINABILITY INTERNATIONAL SUMMER SCHOOL

LAW

- The UCD Sutherland School of Law is the only Irish Law School to be ranked in the top 50 Law Schools in the World by the Times Higher Education Subject Rankings, 2018.
- The School offers degree programmes in law as a stand-alone discipline or in combination with other disciplines including Business, History, Economics, Philosophy, Politics, Chinese Studies and Social Justice.

WHAT IS STUDY ABROAD?

UCD's Study Abroad programmes offer visiting undergraduate students a unique educational opportunity to participate fully in the academic and social life of Ireland's Global University for a semester and/or full year of study.

ACADEMIC PROGRAMME

Students should apply for the UCD Study Abroad programme in the academic area where they are taking the majority of their modules.

- Study Abroad students can take up to six modules (classes) per semester at UCD. The minimum number of modules that students can take at UCD is four modules.
- Study Abroad students have access to the full range of undergraduate modules available at UCD, subject to prerequisites, capacity and timetabling.
- Students have the option to register for four modules within their main programme and up to two modules from across the university.
- Students are pre-registered for modules before they arrive at UCD and have up to two weeks after the start of term to change their modules.

MODULE (COURSE) DETAILS

You can find module (course) details on the UCD online course catalogue at www.ucd.ie/students/course_search.htm. Study Abroad students have the option to study stage one, introductory; stage two, intermediate; or stage three, advanced modules and stage four graduate modules in some academic areas with academic approval.

STUDY ABROAD STUDENT SUPPORT

The Study Abroad team provides outstanding support before students leave home, when they first arrive on campus and throughout their time at UCD. The support system includes:

- Pre-arrival support and information
- Cultural transition support
- Extensive orientation programme
- Housing assistance
