Reminder about On-line Research Professional Planning (RPDP) Forms

The Research Professional and Development Planning (RPDP) form moved online over Summer 2023 and has proved very successful with faculty and students. It is important to remember that students must sign off on this form, after the Chair has signed off on behalf of the RSP, to properly close out this process for a given meeting.

How to prepare to close your Connect IT account

If you have completed your studies, you should consider what you are going to do with your files and emails as you prepare to leave the University.

Access to most IT services that you are entitled to, as a registered student, will end on the last day of the term which you were last registered to.

Generally these dates are August, December and May. Any actions should be completed on or before these dates. [Link with details](#).

If your current academic year is:

- May 2023/2024, the last day of your registered term is 18 May 2025.
- September 2024/2025, the last day of your registered term is 31 August 2025.
- January 2024/2025, the last day of your registered term is 31 December 2025.
