 possible to be prioritised
- Support NCHD experience on site through minor capital investments towards facilities eg residence facilities
- Any other priorities as identified by the NDTP Trainer and Lead NCHDs

Please note funding provided under this funding scheme is <u>once off funding</u> and is not an indication or commitment to continued funding for projects and initiatives. Therefore, when submitting applications, please ensure you consider the sustainability of projects. Whilst the funding available is limited; funding will be made through a competitive process and we may not be able to fund each of the applications but we want to hear about all your great projects and initiatives ideas. The budget should only be for the amount required for the project. A successful project application may be funded for a smaller amount if the panel feel that would be more appropriate.

- Consultants may apply but applications must be led by the NCHD.

- Upon completion of the project, two documents must be submitted to the NDTP Trainer Lead:
 - (i) An evaluation report of the project; and,
 - (ii) A 300 word abstract of the project.
- Any advertisement or communication (including course materials) of the funded project/initiative, or publications that arise, must acknowledge clearly that it was funded by NDTP.
- The host agency is responsible for the financial and administrative co-ordination of the project/initiative
