Provided that the National Folklore Collection is duly acknowledged as the source, the consulted material may be quoted in lectures and the like without further formality.

On receipt of permission to publish, the following acknowledgement is recommended for inclusion in the publication: The National Folklore Collection, UCD.

Footnotes and endnotes are suggested as follows:

Main/Schools' Manuscripts Collection

National Folklore Collection (henceforth NFC), Manuscript number, page number, informant, age, occupation, address. Collector, date.

Example:

NFC 1280: 2-6; James Murphy (76), Ballinasloe, County Galway. Collector: Liam Mac Coisdeala, January 1942.

The Schools' Manuscripts Collection should be referenced in the following manner:

NFCS 15:10-12; Joe Malone (50), Feakle, County Clare. Collector: Mary Malone, Feakle National School, County Clare, 1936. Teacher: Mary Considine

Sound Archive

National Folklore Collection (henceforth NFC), sound archive reference, item number, informant, age, occupation, address. Collector, date.

Example:

NFC TM163/A/2; John Reilly (80), farmer, Ballydesmond, County Cork. Collector: Tom Munnely, 16th June 1972.

Photographic Archive

National Folklore Collection, reference number related to indexing system from *Handbook of Irish Folklore*. Caption. Photographer, date.

Example:

NFC H001.15.00062 (These reference numbers may be included with credit listings). 'May Day Bush, Athy, Co. Kildare'. Photographer: Caoimhín Ó Danachair, May 1954.
