School of Mathematics and Statistics is pleased to announce scholarship opportunities for graduate students on full time Masters programmes. Applications for scholarships of up to 50% tuition fees will be accepted.

<u>Application process</u>: no separate application is required. All eligible applicants who complete their programme application by 31st May 2016 will be considered for the scholarship.

The scholarship committee will assess all eligible candidates on their merits.

Successful applicants will be informed by 30th June 2016.

Taught Graduate Scholarships Terms and Conditions

- The Scholarship Program is funded by UCD School of Mathematics and Statistics to attract excellent candidates to the School's taught graduate programs and encourage early application;
- 2. The scholarship will cover the awarded amount against tuition fees;
- 3. Scholarships will be paid out after the first instalment of tuition fees have been paid by the student;
- 4. Scholarship awards are applicable to full time Masters programmes, this is excluding online based programmes;
- 5. This scholarship is not eligible to be combined with any other tuition scholarship;
- 6. Only complete applications received before the scholarship deadline will be considered;
- 7. Applicants must be self-funding;
- 8. Successful candidates will be selected on merit;
- 9. Once scholarship awards are issued, students must accept this offer by the specified method within two weeks of the notification being distributed by the committee. It is the student's responsibility to formally accept the scholarship offer, a non-response will be considered as declining the offer;
- 10. Students awarded a scholarship must commit to attending UCD Open Events where required. Students must also agree to join the Student Ambassador Panel and provide testimonials, or podcasts on their experience at UCD where required;
- 11. A student who withdraws, cancels or becomes inactive, is suspended, or dismissed from the University will lose his/her scholarship eligibility. A student who takes such a status due to medical reasons may appeal in writing to Scholarship Committee to have his/her scholarship

reinstated. The appeal must be submitted with supporting documentation, such as a letter from a doctor. In such a case, for there to be a possibility for reinstatement, a student's leave from the University cannot exceed two consecutive semesters;

12. A student who declines an initial offer of admission and accompanying scholarship offer will not retain his/her scholarship offer if he/she reapplies at a later date.
