We remember the Irish polymath and UCD alumnus, Brian O'Doherty, MB BCh BAO '52. O'Doherty transformed from doctor to art critic and artist aka <u>Patrick Ireland</u> (1972 – 2008). He was a medic who became a leading figure in the New York art scene after studying medicine at UCD, Cambridge University UK & Harvard University Mass, USA. Mr O'Doherty died on 7th November, at the age of 94.

Brian O'Doherty, UCD School of Medicine Alumnus 1952 RIP

R.I.P. Brian O'Doherty, UCD School of Medicine Alumnus 1952, art critic and artist aka <u>Patrick Ireland</u> (1972 – 2008) was the Irish polymath, who became a leading figure in the New York art scene after studying medicine at UCD, died on November 7th last, at the age of 94.

Having graduated from UCD School of Medicine 1952, he completed a fellowship in experimental psychology at Cambridge University and in 1957 he moved to Harvard University to study Public Health. By the time he completed his master's degree in 1960, Mr O'Doherty had largely left medicine behind.

His sculpture, 'Newman's Razor' was created in 1972 and is displayed at the courtyard of Belfield House, UCD. <u>READ MORE HERE</u>

Prestigious Wellcome Leap® award for UCD team tackling stillbirth prevention

A team of biomedical engineers and clinicians in University College Dublin (UCD) and Imperial College London, including Principal Investigator (PI) <u>Professor Niamh</u> <u>Nowlan</u> and co-PI <u>Professor Fionnuala McAuliffe</u>, have developed a unique wearable baby movement monitoring system, which they hope will address the urgent need to enable monitoring of babies' movements in the womb at home, and dramatically reduce stillbirths globally. The expert team has been awarded a contract as part of Wellcome Leap's <u>In Utero programme</u>, which aims to create the scalable capacity to measure, model and predict gestational development with a primary goal to reduce stillbirth rates by half.
