
GenOMICC consortium including UCD School of Medicine involved in genome sequencing reveals host factors underlying critical Covid-19

The world's largest study of the genetics of critical COVID-19, involving more than 57,000 people, has revealed fresh details about some of the biological mechanisms behind the severe form of the disease. This study conducted by GenOMICC consortium - was led in Ireland by Professor Alistair Nichol, Chair of Critical Care Medicine, UCD School of Medicine, Consultant at St Vincent's University Hospital, and Director of the Irish Critical Care-Clinical Trials Network, based at UCD. UCD St Vincent's University Hospital study shows that D-dimer measurement combined with Machine Learning (ML), can improve & rule-out of PE (Pulmonary Embolism)

Associate Professor Cormac McCarthy,
Consultant Respiratory Physician, SVUH,
Associate Professor, UCD School of
Medicine is the Senior Author of a study
which investigates if D-dimers combined
with clinical factors in a trained machine
learning model, improves prediction of PE
(Pulmonary Embolus) in moderate-risk
patients who have a CT scan to detect
PE. This single-centre study was
conducted by the Department of
Respiratory Medicine, St Vincent's

The study's co-author, Assistant
Professor **Dr Kathleen Curran**,
Diagnostic Imaging, UCD School of
Medicine and Director, UCD Machine
Learning in Medical Imaging Research
Group said, 'These exploratory results
demonstrate that, modern analytical
methods combined with readily available
clinical information can be used to
improve patient care and healthcare
efficiency in common, high-stakes areas
such as the investigation and
management of venous
thromboembolism.'



<u>UCD Newman Fellow</u> and infectious diseases specialist **Dr Brendan O'Kelly** is working with colleagues at UCD School of Medicine and Dublin's Mater Misericordiae University Hospital to improve outcomes for patients with symptoms of long Covid. Dr Kelly is supervised by UCD Professor <u>Jack Lambert</u>.

The findings of a pilot study into the safety and efficacy of low-dose naltrexone as a treatment for patients experiencing symptoms for at least 3 months post-infection with the virus were published in the journal Brain, Behaviour, & Immunity – Health.
