UCD School of Nursing, Midwifery and Health Systems Graduate Certificate in Process Improvement in Health Systems NFQ Level 9 (40 ECTS)

Who is this programme for?

This interdisciplinary programme is open to all healthcare staff at all levels and in all settings within the health system. It builds on the <u>Professional Certificate Process Improvement in Health Systems</u> and is designed to prepare you for implementing and leading on a process or quality improvement within your healthcare organisation.

Programme Overview

The programme lays the groundwork for building a healthcare transformation by training you in researching, innovating, co-designing, and implementing solutions, and leading on change in your own organisation. The focus is on both the theoretical principles of process improvement and the mentored implementation of a Process Improvement Project in your own practice setting.

The programme has welcomed students from over 55 healthcare institutions across all hospital groups and Community Healthcare Organisations in Ireland.

Integral to our approach to improvement is our aim to align our programmes with the principles of Person-centredness that contribute to Person-centred cultures.



Graduate Certificate in Process Improvement in Health Systems



Duration

This programme is 1 year in duration.

Delivery Method

The programme is currently delivered via blended learning

- Half-day Graduate Orientation (Trimester 1).
- 9 days lecture attendance (Trimesters 1-3).
- Final Project presentation (duration 30 minutes).
- Time for self-directed learning, research, data analysis and Project development.

Entry Requirements

Healthcare Professionals should have completed the <u>Professional Certificate in Process Improvement in</u> <u>Health Systems</u> or equivalent with UCD or another accredited provider to Level 8.
