



## Quinn School of Business Study Abroad Scholarship

### Terms and Conditions:

1. The scholarship will cover €1,000 (Spring and Autumn semesters) or €500 ( Summer Internship programme) of tuition fees for students on non-EU Business Study Abroad. Applicants should be classified as non-EU for tuition fee and application purposes, and be attending UCD Lochlann Quinn School of Business for either the Autumn, Spring or Summer programme.
2. Scholarships are open to all candidates who have been offered and accepted a place on the UCD Lochlann Quinn School of Business Study Abroad programme.
3. The awardee shall be selected at UCD's discretion, based on the applicant's response to the application questions.
4. Should a candidate have secured other funding or scholarship, it is the candidate's responsibility to ensure that this scholarship does not affect eligibility for the funding already secured and can be used in combination.
5. A decision to accept the scholarship is required two weeks after receipt of the offer.
6. The Scholarship award will be applied to the student's account in advance of the start date of the teaching term for applicable period. The student will be responsible for the balance of their tuition fees, either to UCD directly or via their home school as per the existing study abroad agreements. There is no cash alternative to the scholarship.
7. By applying for the scholarship, each applicant agrees that if he or she is awarded a scholarship, his or her name and identity may be announced publically and his/her name, background story and/or image may be used to promote the scholarship programme. UCD may also ask the awardee to participate in certain promotional and marketing activities.
8. By applying for the scholarship, each applicant consents to his or her personal data being used for the purposes of assessing the scholarship application and consents to his application being shared with his/her home institution as the case may be.
9. Students awarded a Scholarship must commit to acting as a Student Ambassador, provide testimonials, short journal, vlog or podcasts on their experience at UCD where required. The University may feature a Scholarship recipient's profile in publications. Successful candidates must agree to act as an ambassador for the programme on their return to their home campus and attend study abroad fairs.
10. Students awarded a Scholarship must undertake between 20-30 ECTS for the semester programme and 10 ECTS plus the allocated internship position for the summer programme.
11. It is the responsibility of the Scholarship recipient as a student of the University to familiarise themselves with the University's Code, Academic Regulations, and any relevant University Policies, Procedures and Codes of Practice.
12. A student who withdraws, cancels, becomes inactive, is suspended, or dismissed from the University will lose his/her Scholarship eligibility and shall be responsible for the full cost of tuition fees, unless the awardee sets out extenuating circumstances, which solely at UCD's discretion, may be taken into account. Student's leave from the University cannot exceed two consecutive semesters
13. A student who declines an initial offer of admission and accompanying Scholarship offer will not retain his/her Scholarship offer if he/she reapplies at a later date.
