Cultural Programme

The Quinn Summer Internship Programme provides students with the opportunity to experience Irish society, culture, and history through a series of organised excursions.

Academic Learning

The academic component of the programme is an intensive two-week period delivered by leading academic staff at the UCD Lochlann Quinn School of Business.

Each student will complete two classes:

Ireland's International Business
Environment

and one from either

- Global Finance or
- Responsible Management, Sustainability and Society.

Timeline & Key Dates

March - Application deadline is March 10th.

April - Online interview to discuss motivations, experience and Internship preferences.

May - Notification of placement opportunities. On-campus accommodation booking.

June - Arrive to Dublin and Orientation. Programme start.

Credit Transfer

All UCD academic modules are worth 5 ECTS. The final decision regarding credit transfers is made by the home school/university. UCD will issue an official transcript at the end of the programme. As a guide we recommend that 5 ECTS = 3 US credits.

Eligibility

The minimum GPA for application is 3.00. Detailed information on application procedure and eligibility is available on the website listed below. Please note this programme is very competitive and attention should be paid to the application process.
