Strengths of the thesis: This must outline the strengths of the thesis based upon an analysis of its academic quality.	Reports which include nothing but generic comments which apply to any research.

Corrections Required: This must contain a high-level summary of any corrections that may be required by the candidate. A detailed list of typographical corrections should not be included and can be shared directly with the candidate.	The report contains no high-level summary, or quite detailed corrections.
	Reports which require corrections and yet are submitted within a very short timeframe will be queried.
Rationale for Recommendation: This must provide a clear rationale for the outcome of the examination and the recommendation to award the degree or otherwise.	This must contain the reasoning behind the recommendation – and not just a restatement of that recommendation or a summary of the thesis.
Publication Outcome: This must state whether the thesis is publishable either in whole or in part.	Doctoral level 10 degrees must be at least partly worthy of publication if the degree is to be awarded; Masters level 9 degrees need not be worthy of publication.
Analysis of the Viva performance: This must contain a summary of how the student performed in the viva voce, where it is required.	This must contain an analysis of the student's academic performance at the viva, personal comments regarding the student should not be included.
