



Existing knowledge


Challenge: Funding for social housing reduced by 88% after the 2007-2008 economic bust



Research projects addressing four main questions:

- Why was social housing output higher in the past despite regular recessions?
- How do other European countries fund social housing?
- How does social housing influence the housing market?
- How can Irish social housing funding be reformed?




