Travelling to UCD

Plane (Dublin Airport)

- [Aircoach](#) 700 bus from Dublin Airport to Leopardstown / Sandyford / Stillorgan which passes UCD. Make sure to board the Aircoach 700 to Leopardstown and exit at UCD. The journey takes approximately 45 minutes.
- The Dublin Bus [Airlink 747](#) also connects Dublin Airport and Heuston Train Station via the city centre, from which buses 46A and 145 go to UCD.

Train

- Dublin is served by two main railway stations: Connolly Station and Heuston Stations.
- From Connolly Station walk to O'Connell Street, where the Dublin Bus numbers 2, 11 and 46A can be boarded for UCD.
- The route 145 provides a direct route from Heuston Station to Belfield via the city centre.

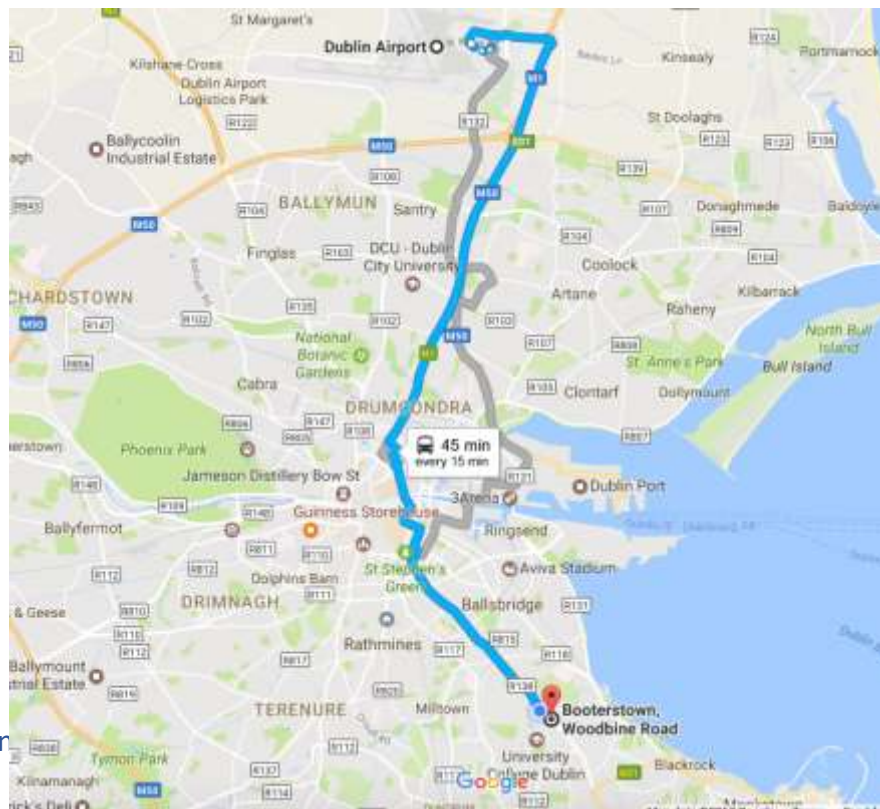
Taxi

It is possible to hail a taxi from the street, but convenient taxi ranks are located on O'Connell Street, Middle Abbey Street, Dame Street and St Stephens Green, as well as the airport, but they may be more expensive. Dublin map

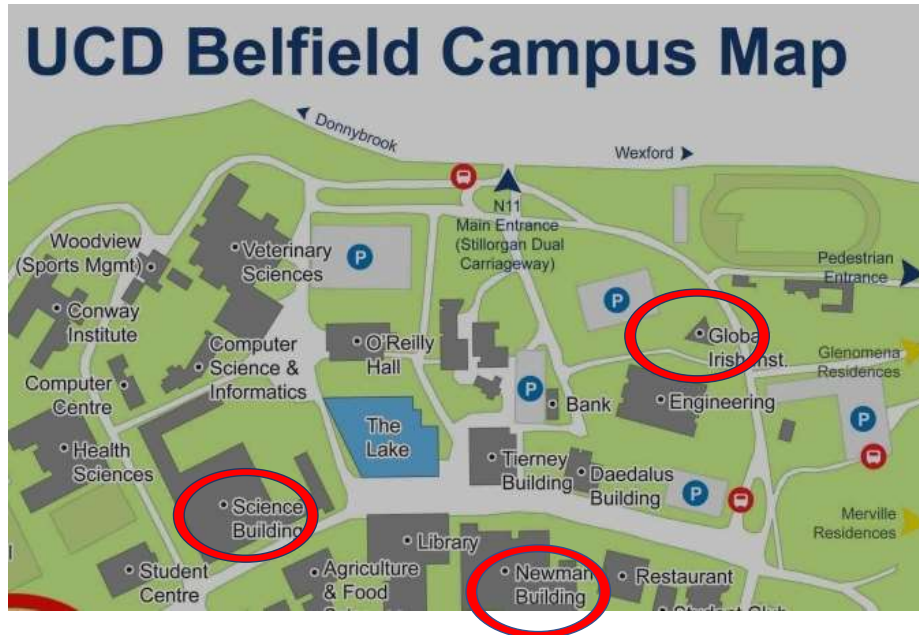
