ACCESS TO IMPORTANT SERVICES

Each student in UCD is provided with a UCD Connect account, so you have access to key online services. Through UCD Connect, you get unlimited combined Gmail and Google Drive storage plus a personal calendar with your Your personalised

student timetable in it.



Useful tip: Sync these to your smartphone, so you have easy access to information wherever you are!

You also have access to the University's eLearning environment (Blackboard), where you can submit assignments, check announcements, and use wikis and blogs. Software applications are available to download or stream from AppsAnywhere on UCD Connect.

USERNAME

Your username is your UCD student number.

PASSWORD

If you have already created a password for SISWeb, please use that. Otherwise, your default password is your date of birth (in the format ddmmyy).



! Your IT security is your own responsibility so make sure you change your password on first login and remember to use a strong password. There is a change password tool in UCD Connect. Never share your username or password.

Your personalised UCD email address will be used for official UCD correspondence including a fortnightly student e-zine and academic and exams information. Please make sure that you check it regularly.

Ensure the Anti-Virus software on your laptop is up to date. Sophos Anti-Virus software is available to download for free to all registered students through UCD Connect.



UCD MOBILE

Before arriving on campus you can download a free app called 'UCD Mobile' for both Apple and Android devices. It includes an interactive map of the campus (with an augmented-reality view of locations for iPhone users), handy access to Blackboard content and announcements (Blackboard Mobile Learn) as well as a library catalogue search function, news updates, an events calendar, sports fixtures social and dining options and much more!

IMPORTANT DATES

Most Programmes start at the beginning of the academic year in early September. The start date for your programme will be stated on your offer letter. Research programmes can usually start at the beginning of September, January or May. HOW TO REGISTER ONLINE



Before you begin the academic year at UCD, you will need to fully register with the University. Registration allows you to obtain your UCD Student Card (UCARD) and gain access to the wide range of facilities available to our students.

Check key dates to see when online registration opens for your programme.

To access online registration, go to UCD Connect and click on the **SISWeb** icon. Enter your UCD Connect username and password when asked.

If you are a new student your username is your UCD student number and your default password is your date of birth (ddmmyy) - you can change your password once you have logged in.

If you were a student of UCD in the last three years your computer account and email details remain the same.

The **Enter Registration Process** button will bring you to the online registration pages. The first time you click on it you are confirming your registration for 2017/18.

Your UCD Connect account will be available 48 hours in advance of online registration. Blackboard access will be available within 24 hours of registering to your programme. If you have any questions or problems with the registration process, please contact your College/School directly. Please see Registration 2017/18 for times, a step-bystep guide to registration and other support information.

If you withdraw on or before 20 October 2017, you will receive a full refund of any payments made subject to point 1.4 of the refunds policy.


