The [Pyla-Koutsopetria Archaeological Project](#) developed its objectives and methods within a landscape approach to archaeological research. This approach is consistent with recent work on Cyprus and elsewhere in the Mediterranean (e.g. [Given, Knapp, Coleman 2003](#)). While "landscape archaeology" is open multiple definitions, our interpretation of a landscape approach views archaeology as a particular discourse located at the intersection of the cultural (i.e. textual sources, ceramic artifacts, architectural features, et c.), physical (i.e. geological, topographical, et c.), and methodological (i.e. procedural, technological, et c.) space. the american heart association published a position paper focusing on lifestyle interventions to prevent heart disease (see <http://circ.ahajournals.org/content/early/2013/10/07/01.cir.0000435173.25936.e1.citation>). they note:

- there is abundant evidence that the risk of heart disease is much lower in those with better cardiovascular health metrics (nonsmoking, good diet, physical activity, normal BMI, normal BP, optimal lipids and normal fasting glucose): 78% less heart disease over 5.8 years in those with 5 or more of the above compared to those with none, with similar numbers in longer term studies
- younger adults with healthy behaviors track to having lower biological risk as they age.
- those with initially poorer health behaviors who can change them do better clinically.
- health care providers, even with brief interventions, are able to help patients quit smoking, improve their diets, and increase physical activity.

RSS Feeds

Advantages:

- Save time
- Convenience – have all your updates come to one portal
- Keep updates separate from email (spam, blocked messages, etc.)
- Don't have to give out personal details (well, not always at least)

In order to read these RSS feeds, you need an **RSS reader**.

RSS readers can be either Web-based or software you download onto your computer.

Majority are freely available!



What are RSS feeds?

RSS stands for "RDF Site Summary" or "Really Simple Syndication". It provides a mechanism to subscribe to "headlines" from a web site. RSS can be used as an alternative to electronic tables of contents for receipt of up-to-date TOC and Abstract information, or as a way of syndicating information from this website on another site.

What information is available via RSS?

The RSS feeds provide TOC and Abstract information for recent and current issues of each journal. Two feeds are available for this journal:

- RSS** Contributions to Political Economy - RSS feed of current issue
- RSS** Contributions to Political Economy - RSS feed of recent issues (covers the latest 3 issues, including the current issue)


