Democracy in the 21st Century



Dr. Garret FitzGerald had a pronounced impact on Ireland not only as an active politician but as a thinker and commentator.

He had a deeply-rooted commitment to the role of the university, and to University College Dublin in particular where he studied and lectured, as well as the National University of Ireland of which he was Chancellor. Reflecting that relationship, an annual series of 'Spring Schools' named in his honour is being initiated by UCD, co-sponsored by the Irish Times. The first, on the theme 'Democracy in the 21st Century', focuses on his legacy, on democracy in the European Union, on human rights and the common good, and on trust and the media. The issues and concerns to which Garret FitzGerald devoted so much of his intellectual energy are still central to Ireland's economic and social development; the aim of this series is to deepen reflection and debate on how best to build on his legacy.
