Module Information and Assessment

Study abroad students have access to the full range of undergraduate modules available at UCD* (* subject to capacity and timetabling). You can register for up to four modules in your subject area and up to two modules from other Programme areas. You may also take all of your modules within your chosen subject area.*

Assessment is based on a combination of in-semester components such as projects, class based assignments and formal examinations which take place at the end of each semester ie in December and May.

Research Opportunity

The "Introduction to Scientific Research" module offers Science study abroad students the opportunity to become active members of a research group in University College Dublin. These research groups work in areas ranging from biological, biomedical, chemical, geological, physical, mathematical and computer science. The student will shadow

a member of the research team and master one basic and one advanced laboratory skill. They will learn about developing a research hypothesis and how to design an experiment to test this hypothesis. Students will also learn how to analyze research data, write a scientific abstract as well as how to make a scientific presentation.

Credit Transfer
