### Position Summary:

UCD Veterinary Hospital (UCDVH) is seeking to appoint a career grade veterinary nurse for small animal medicine to provide a high standard of nursing care by assuming shared responsibilities for a specific discipline team and by helping to co-ordinate patient flow through hospital services.

Candidates must hold a Veterinary Nursing Qualification registerable with the Veterinary Council of Ireland.

### Principal Duties and Responsibilities:

#### 1. Nursing duties

- Provide a high standard of nursing care and carry out specific nursing procedures at the direction of or under the supervision of a veterinary practitioner as permitted within *Part 8* of the Veterinary Practice Act 2005.
- Help co-ordinate the nursing support for the department.
- Participate in nurse led services.
- Maintain a high standard of hygiene, cleanliness and organisation with emphasis on infection control for patients, staff, students and visitors to UCDVH.

#### 2. Administration duties

- Ensure effective communication between discipline teams and management.
- Help co-ordinate patient flow through hospital services.
- Participate in helping prepare rosters and managing daily logistics, stock control and purchasing using e-procurement.
- Assist in equipment maintenance, repair and co-ordination of service contacts.
- Help create and implement local protocols and participate in developing hospital protocols.
- Ensure infection control policies are adhered to at all times.
- Ensure Health & Safety policies are adhered to at all times.

#### 3. Teaching & training

- Supervision and training of veterinary medicine and nursing students.
- Supervision and training of junior (rotating) nurses.
- Assessment of veterinary medicine and nursing students.
- Demonstration and training of practical nursing skills.
- Instruction in nursing care.

- Instruction in the use of hospital equipment.
- Delivery of in-house teaching and CPD.
- Participation in UCDVH annual conference.

**Particular to this position:** You will be required to work 36.5 hours per week over 5 days during the week between Monday and Sunday. Weekend and weekday out-of-hours working may be required on a rota basis. Start and finish times will vary depending on the needs of the hospital. The actual allocation of these hours of work will be arranged with your line manager.
