


# Cycling Greenway Dungarvan -Waterford

B&B 10 km outside of Waterford city















### Getting on a bike

### **Viaducts & Tunnels**

Ballyvoyle Tunnel and Viaduct

built in the 1870s, blown up during civil war and rebuilt 1924

Used in 1990s for Bungee Jumping

Restored in recent years

- Westport Newport (12km)
- Newport Mulranny (18km)
- Mulranny Achill (13km)
- Total 43 km

## Planning for Great Western Greenway

How to get there

Travel by train or bus to Westport, or a car (Mullrany, Newport, Achill)

How long to stay to make the best of the trip

3 nights accommodation

How long does it take to complete

Trip can be completed in one day however the parts of it can be tiring for not experience cyclist

- Shuttle bus included in a price




# Day 1:Beginning in Newport

- The greenway became reality in 2010, when the section between Newport and Mulranny officially opened.
- The greenway in place of old railway between Westport and Achill closed in 1937








## What to expect: Newport –Mulranny

## Day 2: Newport –Westport 12 km


- Cycling time : up to 1,5
- This is the shortest section of the Great Western Greenway
- "Sunday stroll" great connection between the two west Mayo towns.
- There are no services on this section, but being the shortest, it doesn't take long to complete.


### Gorey, County Wexford

- 84km from UCD accessible by all public transport and M11
- By car from UCD 1hr 6 min Motorway no tolls

- By Bus from Montrose Stillorgan 1-hour 20min










Secret No 2: Tara Hill trail Family friendly hike (5.4km)








#### St Anne's Park, Clontarf/Raheny

- •7 km (2.5 hours)
- Linear cliff walk, footpath
- Can return by Dart





## Hiking Spots and Walks

#### Malahide to Portmarnock coastal walk

- •4 km
- Elevated seaside walk
- Wide paths (good for families and joggers)
- Can continue walk on Portmarnock beach (+2.5km)





# Birdwatching Spots

#### North Bull Island, Clontarf

- •5 km
- First bird sanctuary in Ireland
- •180+ bird species recorded
- Wildlife habitat
- Dollymount strand







## Birdwatching Spots

#### **Booterstown Nature Reserve**

- Marshland (only remaining marsh in South Dublin)
- Resting spot for migrating birds
- Freshwater & saltwater
- Blackrock Park nearby (1.5 Km)

#### Birdwatch Ireland East Coast Nature Reserve, Wicklow

- Part of Murrough Wetlands
- Area of conservation
- •4km
- Free
